## Razne najnovejše svetovne vesti

NEW YORK — Grčija je pred varnostnim koncilom Zvezne narodov včeraj uradno obtožila sovjetske vazalke: Jugoslavijo, Bolgarijo in Albanijo, da podpirajo gerilce v Grčiji.

COLUMBUS, O. — Timken Roller Bearing Co. je odslovala 1,000 delavcev v svojih tovarnah v Columbusu in Cantetu. Pravi, da ne more dobiti dovolj materiala.

SOUTH BEND, IND. — Studebaker Co. bo v torek prenehala izdelovati potniške avte. Vzrok je stavka pri Murray Corp. v Detroitu, ki izdeluje avtov ogrodja. Pri Studebaker Co. bo prizadetih 10,000 delavcev.

WASHINGTON. — Državni oddelki bo začel v oktobru oddajati radijske programe v Arabijo in Turčijo.

WASHINGTON. — Vlada je dobila 11 milijonov dolarjev, da bo mogla čekirati lojalnost vladnih uslužencev v raznih vladnih uradilih.

CHICAGO. — Na žitni borzi je koruza zopet poskočila za 7 in četrta centa pri bušju. Včeraj je bila \$1.94½ bušelj. Pšenica je poskočila pa za 5 centov.

COLUMBUS, O. — Koruzna letina v državi Ohio bo letos za eno tretjino manjša od lanske, poroča poljedelski urad ohiskske univerze. Vrhuta tega bo letina najmanj 3 tedne zakanjena, ker je slabo vreme zadrljalo setev.

ATENE. — Grški rebeli so začeli včeraj napadati ob turški meji. Nekateri misljijo, da si hočejo komunisti pridobiti več ozemlja in potem razglasiti sovjetsko republiko v severni Grčiji.

PARIZ. — Maurice Torez, vodja francoskih komunistov, bo v nedeljo odgovoril generalu de Gaulle, ki je pred 90,000 brojčico množico izjavil, da je namen komunistov zaslužiti ves svet.

STOCKHÖLM. — Švedska vlada je protestirala v Moskvi, ker sta dva urednika sovjetskega poslanstva z bicikli prepovedala Švedsko in si ogledala razne vojaške naprave, ne da bi za to vprašala dovoljenje.

## Australija zahteva od Zveze narodov, naj poseže na Javo

Tam divja vojna med Nizozemsko vlado in domačo republiko

Canbera. — Ministrski predsednik Avstralije, J. B. Chifley, naznanja, da je Avstralija naročila svoji delegaciji pri Zvezi narodov, naj opozori varnostni koncil na vojno na Javi ter da naj stopi v akcijo po členu 39. čarterja Zveze narodov.

Ta člen dolča, da mora varnostni koncil določiti, če je ogrožen mir, če je bil kršen mir, ali če je bil izvršen napad. Potem naj pa koncil podvzame korake, da se zopet vzpostavi mir.

Na Javi in Sumatri divja vojna med četami Nizozemske vlade in med četami Indonezijske republike.

To je prvič, da je pozvan varnostni koncil Zveze narodov, naj se ravna po čarterju ter ga uveljavlja.

## Sovjetska Rusija je dala Albaniji kredit

London. — Iz Moskve se poroča, da je bil dovoljen Albaniji "mal kredit" za nakup industrijske opreme in poljedelskih strojev. To posojilo ali kredit je izposoja v Moskvi premier Hodža, ki je bil tam. Iz Moskve tudi poročajo, da so bila obravnavana druga važna vprašanja v korist Sovjetske Rusije in Albanije, predno je Hodža odšel domov.

Za te kredite, ki jih je dovolila Rusija Albaniji, bo Rusija poslala v Albanijo strojno opremo in poljedelske stroje. To bo najbrže del "Molotovske načrte" za obnovo vzhodne Evrope, ki hoče tekmovati s programom ameriškega državnega tajnika Marshalla, ki je predlagal program za obnovo vse Evrope, kateremu se pa Rusija ni hotela pridružiti.

## Se ji najbrže dopade v tistih krajih

Louisville, Ill. — George Baker je ujel pred 16 leti želvo, ji urezal na hrbitenico svoje ime in dan ter jo izpustil. Te dni jo je spet ujel in sicer samo pol milje od kraja, kjer jo je pred 16 leti izpustil.

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## JUGOSLAVIJA IN BOLGARIJA NIMATA STRAHU PRED ATOMSKIMI BOMBAMI

Belgrad. — Georgi Dimitrov, ministrski predsednik Bolgarije, je izjavil, da se Jugoslavija in Bolgarija ne bojita atomskih bomb, ali grožnje o novi vojni. Take grožnje oplašijo samo take, ki imajo slabe možgane in slabe žive.

Prejno se je Dimitrov odpeljal iz Belgrada v Zagreb, je dobil od Tita dvoje dolikanj: eno za prizadevanje bratskih vezi med obema deželama in drugo radi posebne posluge v boju proti fašizmu.

## Komunistična romunska vlada je prevedala kmetsko stranko

Bucharest. — Z izgovorom, da je bila v zaroti s tujimi imperialističnimi interesami, je romunska komunistična vlada razpustila kmetsko stranko.

Ta je rikelj, da bo še najprej v Kanado na oddih, potem bo pa potoval po deželi, da otiplje v raznih državah pri republikanskih voditeljih, če bi bil sprejet za kandidata.

Ker sedanji zakoni prepovedujejo vsako novo stranko, če tega ne dovoli vlada, so komunisti brez vsake organizirane opozicije. Vsi glavni voditelji kmetske stranke so že v jedi pod raznimi obtožbami, toda noben se ni bil javno obtožen.

S tem najnovejšim odlokom je vlada zaprla vse urade te stranke, vse premoženje je zaplenjeno od države in vsa glasila stranke prepovedana.

Parlament je z 299 glasovi proti 1 odobril ta korak vlade, ki ga je izvršil notranji minister. Kdo je volil proti, nima znano, ker je bilo glasovanje tajno.


## Terroristi so obesili dva angleška vojaka v Palestini

## Republikanci v Ohio so indorsirali senatorja Tafta

Taft bo njih predsedniški kandidat prihodnje leta na narodni konvenciji

Columbus, O. — Ohijski republikanci so včeraj uradno izbrali senatorja Robert A. Tafta za predsedniškega kandidata prihodnje leta. Taft je pa izjavil, da se glede kandidature še ni odločil, ker da hoče najprej zvedeti, kaj bo rekla k temu publike.

"Najprej hočem zvedeti sentiment naroda in preračunati, če imam sploh priliko biti nominiran," je rekel Taft časniki.

Voditelji v Ohio trdijo, da ima Taft že zdaj zagotovljenih 290 glasov na konvenciji, kar je manj kot polovica, kolikor jih potrebuje za nominacijo.

Taft je rikelj, da bo še najprej v Kanado na oddih, potem bo pa potoval po deželi, da otiplje v raznih državah pri republikanskih voditeljih, če bi bil sprejet za kandidata.

Demokratični voditelji

Lausche sam se še ni izjavil, če bo zopet kandidiral, toda iz vseh krajev države se slišijo glasovi, naj bi kandidiral. Demokratični odbor v okraju Lorain, znani življenski standard ter zahtevati od delavcev v glavnih industrijih več ur dela.

Premier Attlee je povedal parlamentu, da so te odredbe potrebne, če se hoče odvrniti ekonomski polom v deželi. O vsem tem bo Attlee govoril na radiu po radiu na 10. avgusta.

Attlee se je že sestal z voditelji unijskih premogarjev ter zahteval, naj premogarji delajo vsak dan eno uro več, za kar bodo plačani čas in pol.

## Povojsna Evropa

Procedure v Evropi so blazne in uničevalne. One rezentajo to, kar misijo nihovi blazni vladarji in despoti, da je dobro zanje, kar je usodna napaka. Velike kontinentalne pokrajine so danes v večjem brezupju in večji mizeriji kakor so bile za časa vojne. Položaj Zedinjenih držav v tem svetovnem kaosu je najudovitejši izmed vseh ostalih položajev, to pa zato, ker Zed, države niso tat v družbi tator ter se v tej zmešnjavi ne udejstvujejo za profit, temveč v svojo izgubo zaradi svojih dobrih namenov.

Se nikoli v povojsni zgodovini ni bil noben mir tako nevaren kakor je sedanj. Človeku je prav lahko razumeti čustva, s katerimi so zmagovalci sprejeli predajo Nemčije. Pod grožnjim in neušmiljencim voditeljem, katerega je milijone ljudi njegovega lastnega kova oboževalo, je nudila Nemčija primer neusmiljenosti, ki je tirala v blaznost njenje žrtve. Nobeno čudo torej, da so si ti nesrečniki prizadevali raztrgati svoje tlačitelje na drobne kose, kadar koli in kjer koli se jim je nudila prilika za to. Ampak če bo to naziranje večno prevladovalo, Evrope ne bo mogla živeti, ker to je naziranje in zakon džungle.

Pozabljati se ne sme, da utegne Nemčija v kaki bodoči generaciji postati zopet velesila. Sedanji uničevalci evropske ekonomije ne bodo mogli tega preprečiti z nobenimi odredbami, ki se jih zdaj poslužujejo. Tudi z zaseganjem ozemlja in naravnih pridobitvenih virov ne bo mogoče narediti nemške servilnosti ali napravljanja zgodovinsko dolgega. Za to je namreč vse preveč Nemcev. In med njimi je vse preveč znanstvo in tehnične vede. Zmagovalci ne morejo do tak podreti ter z zemljo izravnati vse nemške bodočnosti, dasi store lahko mnogo pri odločevanju njene usmerjenosti. Možno je, da pride Nemčija popolnoma pod območje Rusije. V tem slučaju bi postala Evropa žrtev kombinacije azijatske divnosti ter nemške filozofije sebičnosti in bi bila vladana iz Moskve.

(Ono nedeljo je Drew Pearson, znani radijski komentator, izjavil na radiju, da je v miselnosti vseh Nemcev zdaj v prvi vrsti sramotni poraz v zadnji vojni ter želja po maševanju. Zato se Nemci ne bodo zvezali z zapadnimi državami, temveč z Rusijo, ker slednjo manj sovražijo kot zapadne države. — Torej je bojazen zapadnih držav tem bolj upravičena in utemeljena).

Pohlepnot v želji po maševanju je morda čisto naraven pojav v sedanji situaciji. Toda kljub temu to niso činitelji ekonomske obnove ali tega, kar imenujemo in poznamo pod označbo civilizacija.

Brez Nemčije se pohoda Rusije v Evropi ne bo moglo zavestiti. Ko je Hitler pricel svoje blazno divjanje napram svojim sosedom, sta se dve velesili Velika Britanija in Francija — upri njegovemu divjanju, pa tudi manjše države so bile tedaj primeroma močne. Toda videli smo, da se je vse to izkazalo kot prešibko napram Hitlerju. Protiv sovjetskim zavojevalcem, ki vidijo zdaj svojo zlato priliko za nadvlado sveta, pa ni danes nobene obrambe. Oni se danes smatrajo — in ne brez vzroka! — da stoje na pragu marksističnih sanj o supremaciji ali nadvladi sveta.

Nobene opravičbe ni za milo in opravičuječe gledanje na namene sovjetov. To je država prisilnega dela z ogromnimi potencialnimi ali zmožnostmi. Sovjeti morejo producirati ne samo potrebna živila, temveč tudi potrebne industrije. Kot dežela s totalitarnimi merami in odredbami, ki lahko poljubno regimentira delavstvo in vse ostalo ljudstvo, lahko lagje prenese prihodnji ekonomski pretres kakor ostali svet. Trdnega uverjenja sovjetskih mogotov, da je tak ekonomski pretres na potu, ne gre lahko in mimogrede jemati. Ako ameriško ljudstvo izgubi zaupanje v svoj denar, bo propad sveta popoln in revolucionarnemu komunizmu bodo odprte vse poti v svet.

Naš predsednik Truman ter naš državni department si prizadevata zaustaviti to prodiranje z ameriškimi dolarji. Toda tudi če bi bili tudi dolarji na razpolago brez škode za ljudstvo, ki jih mora dajati, se te vidne nesreče ne more zavestiti, dočim je centralna Evropa ekonomska razvalina.

Svet je že razklan na dvoje, kar ni danes menda nikomer več nobena tajnost. Edina iluzija, ki je preostaja, je ta, da bo z ameriškimi dolarji spet mogoče ta svet zgnesti v celoto, kar pa je usodepolna zmota.

Edino orožje proti tej nevarnosti je ljudska zavednost in zavest nevarnosti, ki preti od te strani. Komunisti so prevejanici ter navadno odločno zanikajo, da so res to, kar so. V vsaki debati se poslužujejo svojih znanih fraz o "ustavnih parvica," o "demokraciji," "svobodi tsika in govora" itd, torej o samih pravicah in svoboščinah, o katerih ni v državah, kjer jim oni vlađajo, ne sluha ne duha! . . .

#### (Kratek pregled zgodovine in napredka SZZ)

Cleveland, O. — Minilo je 34 let od kar smo ustanovili Slovensko zadružno zvezo. Leta 1913 in sicer 12. julija je bila odprta prva prodajalna na 152. cesti, katero smo vodili dve leti v istih prostorih. Bili so hudi časi, ker smo imeli dosti na protinikov, naši uposlenci pa še niso imeli potrebnih izkušenj.

Leta 1915 smo kupili lastno poslopje na 767 E. 152 St. od tedanjega lastnika Charlesa Jackca, ki je tam vodil več let goščino in kočno pa se je odločil, da poslopje proda.

Za tiste čase je bila vsota precej velika, posebno za nas, kajti zahvaljuje se je \$6,000. Brez vsakega strahu smo se določili in kupili to poslopje 17. julija 1915, in od takrat in imamo še vedno glavno trgovino na tem prostoru.

Moram omeniti nekaj naših pionirjev, kajti dosti jih je že

den za vse.

Leta 1946 se je naš direktor zavzel, da prenovi našo trgovino na 200. cesti in sicer po sistem domače samopostežbe. To se je tudi zgodilo in na predek se je takoj pokazal.

Letos pa smo še ostali dve trgovini in sicer št. 2 na Waterloo Rd. in glavno trgovino na 152. cesti temeljito preuredili in modernizirali. Priznanje za to delo ga našemu delničarju Rudolfu Grošlmu, ki nam je izdelal načrte za preuređitev vseh treh trgovin. Ne smem pa pozabiti tudi našega delničarja Antona Urankarja, ki je kot stavbenik zgotobil delo, ki odgovarja današnjim razmeram, boljšemu vodstvu in boljši posstrežbi.

Direktorji se trudi in želi posstreži vsem delničarjem in odjemalcem, kolikor je pač v njegovi moći. Dosti izrednega se pa tudi ne more storiti, kajti zadnji čas smo imeli neprilej, kot vsak drugo podjetje: bilo je pomanjkanje živil in učinkovitcev, državljana pa je tuši nas prizadela. ### American with Bulldozer Hunts Captain Kidd's Hoard

Mahone Bay, N. S. — An American with a bulldozer sought today to hit a possible buried treasure jackpot which has eluded generations of pick-and-shovel wielders.

Since 1795, treasure hunters have probed the earth of tiny Oak Island for the fabulous buried Silver cache of Captain Kidd. Now Jacob Faulkenham, Andover, Maine, lumberman, is employing a bulldozer in a new search.

And later in the summer Edward Reichert of New York is expected to turn up with a technical crew, bulldozers, and other heavy equipment. Reichert recently made a survey of the island — a dot of land one mile long and a half mile wide in the bay which once was the haunt of pirates — and said he would be back later.

Captain Kidd, according to local records, was a frequent visitor to this part of Nova Scotia. He was arrested in Boston in 1699 and hanged in London in 1701. Many pirates used the bay as a headquarters. The name Mahone comes from a French word for a pirate craft.

The Oak Island Story began in 1795. Three young men found a great oak there, with marks on a branch indicating a block and tackle had been fastened to it. Underneath was a depression in the grass 13 feet in diameter. They started digging.

Ten feet down was a layer of oak planks. Ten feet farther, a second oak layer; at 30 feet, a third. The work was too tiresome for the trio, and digging was stopped. Six years later a company was organized, and the hole was extended to 90 feet, each 10 feet disclosing a protective layer — one of charcoal, another of pitch.

At 85 feet, they found a flat stone bearing a curious inscription. Some said it read: "Ten feet below, two million pounds lies buried." The diggers hit a cold wooden platform, and then an overnight flood filled the pit with water. They sank another shaft, but water seeped into it from the first.

Half a century later, another expedition sent a boring apparatus into the water. The bore went through the platform and some metal, 22 inches deep. The effort undermined the bottom of the shafts, and mud and water covered the "treasure."

In 1896 there was another try. Twenty shafts were sunk. In 1912 water defeated another enterprise. Four other expeditions, including a costly one last year, also failed.

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


**Leaning Tower  
Of Pisa Slants  
More and More**

\$160,000 Estimated Cost of Reinforcing Its Base; No Danger of Collapse

Pisa, Italy, July 5. — This city's six-hundred-year-old Leaning Tower, one of the wonders of the world, is in need of a one-million dollar foundation reinforcement, a project of the Pisa city engineers disclosed. The tower will have to wait at least "five or six years," however, while Pisa attends to several hundred war repair jobs of greater urgency.

The Leaning Tower is moving more out of line every year. Ranieri Niccolini, one of the officials of the Pisa city engineering department, explained.

Before the war, one thousand tons of cement was placed under the tower in an attempt to steady it, but at least another ten thousand tons are necessary, he estimated.

A wait of half a decade will do the tower no harm, however. The increase in its angle of inclination is only one twenty-fifth of an inch a year. At this rate it would take "several centuries" and possibly as much as two thousand years before it keeled over.

**Foundation Slipping**

The fact that the tower is moving has been known for more than a generation. It's clay foundation, a few feet above the sea level, was always weak. In recent years it has begun to crumble and slip under the tower's unevenly distributed pressure.

The project which the Pisa engineers have in mind would put a cement floor 20 feet deep and 120 feet wide under the tower.

The pre-war project merely succeeded in cutting off some of the water which was washing at the tower's underpinnings, Mr. Niccolini said.

During the war, Pisa's engineers were worried that one of the many bombs which fell on their city might crash close to the tower at the ride toward which it leans. The tower's balance is so delicate that such a blast could have knocked it down. The tower was hit a half dozen times by shells and flak but all were glancing blows which did no structural harm. One of the columns which surround the tower was knocked out and one of a score of bells on the roof was destroyed.

None of the tower's war damage has been repaired. The estimated cost of the restoration is \$2,000. It may be possible to get around to it in another six months, according to Alberto Chelli, who directs the tower's maintenance.

**Heise Family Opens Unique Clinic**

Winona, Minn. — A father and his five sons hung their physicians' and surgeons' shingles on a \$1,000,000 clinic. The Heise family of doctors, unique in America because they all are practicing, offered the services of six specialists to the community. The father, Dr. William F. G. Heise, has been a physician and surgeon here since 1893 and will direct the new clinic. His sons are specialists in surgery, pediatrics, obstetrics and gynecology, pathology and surgery and ear, nose and throat diseases.
