



Razne najnovije svetovne vesti

NEW YORK — Grčija je pred varnostnim koncilom Zveze narodov včeraj uradno obtožila sovjetske vazalke: Jugoslavijo, Bolgarijo in Albanijo, da podpirajo gerilce v Grčiji.

COLUMBUS, O. — Timken Roller Bearing Co. je odslavila 1,000 delavcev v svojih tovarnah v Columbusu in Cantonu. Pravi, da ne more dobiti dovolj materiala.

SOUTH BEND, IND. — Studebaker Co. bo v torku prenehala izdelovati potniške avte. Vzrok je stavka pri Murray Corp. v Detroitu, ki izdeluje avta ogrodja. Pri Studebaker Co. bo prizadetih 10,000 delavcev.

WASHINGTON. — Državni oddelk bo začel v oktobru oddajati radijske programe v Arabijo in Turčijo.

WASHINGTON. — Vlada je dobila 11 milijonov dolarjev, da bo mogla čekirati lojalnost vladnih uslužbencev v raznih vladnih uradih.

CHICAGO. — Na žitni borzi je kornica zopet poskočila za 7 in četrt centa pri bušlju. Včeraj je bila \$1.94¼ bušelj. Pšenica je poskočila pa za 5 centov.

COLUMBUS, O. — Koruzna letina v državi Ohio bo letos za eno tretjino manjša od lanske, poroča poljedelski urad ohajske univerze. Vrh tega bo letina najmanj 3 tedne zakasnela, ker je slabo vreme zadržalo setev.

ATENE. — Grški rebeli so začeli včeraj napadati ob turški meji. Nekateri mislijo, da si hočejo komunisti pridobiti več ozemlja in potem razglasiti sovjetsko republiko v severni Grčiji.

PARIZ. — Maurice Torez, vodja francoskih komunistov, bo v nedeljo odgovoril generalu de Gaulle, ki je pred 90,000 bralci množico izjavil, da je namen komunistov zaslužiti ves svet.

STOCKHOLM. — Švedska vlada je protestirala v Moskvi, ker sta dva uradnika sovjetskega poslanstva z bicikli prapotovala švedsko in si ogledala razne vojaške naprave, na da bi za to vprašala dovoljenje.

DROBNE VESTI IZ SLOVENIJE

BEGUNSKI BOGOSLOVCI. — Iz Jugoslavije. Pa nobeno pisano ni govorilo o tem, da je bogoslovcev je letos študirala pod svojim lastnim vodstvom. Gospod je bil že nejevoljen, da ne dobi nobenega pisem (Bressanone). Vodstvo bogoslovja se je odločilo, da sprejme ponudbo škofa iz San Luisa v Argentini in da se preseli z bogoslovci v Argentino. Glavni razlog je finančno vprašanje. Negotovo je še, kdaj bo mogoče dobiti za vse bogoslovce prevozna sredstva. Verjetno bo to trajalo še precej časa.

OZNA V TABORIŠCIH. — Pisali smo že, kako silno si prizadeva Titova vlada, da bi spravila begunce domov. Ti pa titovcem nič ne verjamejo. Nekaj beguncev se je pač podalo domov, toda v celoti je uspeh tega vabljenja majhen. Poleg raznih komisij je poslala jugoslovanska vlada tudi oznovec v taborišča. Ti poizvedujejo, kaj kdo govori in dela. Tako so v taborišču Bad Aibling v Nemčiji aretirali Amerikanci nekega študenta, ki je imel pri sebi velike svote denarja. Izpovedal je, da je delal po naročilu titovcev in da so mu ti dali na razpolago pol milijona mark. Begunci računajo, da se nahaja samo v ameriškem delu Nemčije preko 50 titovskih tajnih agentov, ki špijonirajo in delajo propagando.

TABORIŠČNE UPRAVE so tudi do zadnjega časa pritiskale na begunce, naj se vrnejo. Tudi ravnatelj taborišča v Spittalu, Novarine, je delal na tem, da bi čim več beguncev spravil iz taborišča. Poizvedoval je, kdo dobi kako pismo iz Slovenije. Pa so mu res prinašali pisma, ki jih pišejo svojci.

Avstralija zahteva od Zveze narodov, naj poseže na Javo

Tam divja vojna med Nizozemsko vlado in domačo republiko

Canberra. — Ministrski predsednik Avstralije, J. B. Chifley, naznanja, da je Avstralija naročila svoji delegaciji pri Zvezi narodov, naj opozori varnostni koncil na vojno na Javi ter da naj stopi v akcijo po členu 39. čarterja Zveze narodov.

Ta člen dolga, da mora varnostni koncil določiti, če je ogrožen mir, če je bil kršen mir, ali če je bil izvršen napad. Potem naj pa koncil podvzame korake, da se zopet vzpostavi mir.

Na Javi in Sumatri divja vojna med četami Nizozemske vlade in med četami Indonezijske republike.

To je prvič, da je pozvan varnostni koncil Zveze narodov, naj se ravna po čarterju ter ga uveljavi.

Sovjetska Rusija je dala Albaniji kredit

London. — Iz Moskve se poroča, da je bil dovoljen Albaniji "mal kredit" za nakup industrijske opreme in poljedelskih strojev. To posojilo ali kredit je izposloval v Moskvi premier Hodža, ki je bil tam. Iz Moskve tudi poročajo, da so bila obravnavana druga važna vprašanja v korist Sovjetske Rusije in Albanije, predno je Hodža odšel domov.

Za te kredite, ki jih je dovela Rusija Albaniji, bo Rusija poslala v Albanijo strojno opremo in poljedelske stroje. To bo najbrže del "Molotovega načrta" za obnovo vzhodne Evrope, ki hoče tekmovati s programom ameriškega državnega tajnika Marshalla, ki je predlagal program za obnovo vse Evrope, kateremu se pa Rusija ni hotela pridružiti.

Se ji najbrže dopade v tistih krajih

Louisville, Ill. — George Baker je ujel pred 16 leti želvo, ji urezal na hrbtnico svoje ime in dan ter jo izpustil. Te dni jo je spet ujel in sicer samo pol milje od kraja, kjer jo je pred 16 leti izpustil.

JUGOSLAVIJA IN BOLGARIJA NIMATA STRAHU PRED ATOMSKIMI BOMBAMI

Belgrad. — Georgi Dimitrov, ministrski predsednik Bolgarije, je izjavil, da se Jugoslavija in Bolgarija ne bojita atomskih bomb, ali grožnje o novi vojni. Take grožnje oplašijo samo take, ki imajo slabe možgane in slabe živce, je rekel Dimitrov.

Predno se je Dimitrov odpeljal iz Belgrada v Zagreb, je dobil od Tita dvojce dolikovanih eno za prizadevanje bratskih vezi med obema deželama in drugo radi posebne posluje v boju proti fašizmu.

Komunistična romunska vlada je prepovedala kmetjsko stranko

Bucharest. — Z izgovorom, da je bila v zaroči s tujimi imperialističnimi interesi, je romunska komunistična vlada razpustila kmetjsko stranko. Tako je zdaj romunski kmetjski narod postavljen pred brez vsake politične stranke. K tej stranki je spadala ogromna večina romunskega naroda.

Ker sedanji zakoni prepovedujejo vsako novo stranko, če tega ne dovoli vlada, so komunisti brez vsake organizirane opozicije. Vsi glavni voditelji kmetjske stranke so že v ječi pod različnimi obtožbami, toda noben še ni bil javno obtožen.

S tem najnovjšim odlokom je vlada zaprla vse urade te stranke, vse premoženje je zaplenjeno od države in vsa glasila stranke prepovedana.

Parlament je z 299 glasovi proti 1 odobril ta korak vlade, ki ga je izvršil notranji minister. Kdo je volil proti, ni znano, ker je bilo glasovanje tajno.

Teroristi so obesili dva angleška vojaka v Palestini

Jeruzalem. — Dva angleška vojaka, ki so ju imeli židovski teroristi kot talca, so obesili iz masčevanja, ker so angleške oblasti usmrtili tri židovske teroriste.

O tem je poročalo židovsko časopisje javno. Vojaka sta bila obsojena na smrt od podtalne židovske organizacije Irgun. Obenem židovski teroristi izjavljajo, da bo zdaj tekla angleška kri v potokih.

Republikanci v Ohio so indorsirali senatorja Tafta

Taft bo njih predsedniški kandidat prihodnje leto na narodni konvenciji

Columbus, O. — Ohijjski republikanci so včeraj uradno izbrali senatorja Roberta A. Tafta za predsedniškega kandidata prihodnje leto. Taft sam je pa izjavil, da se glede kandidature še ni odločil, ker da hoče najprej zvedeti, kaj bo rekla k temu publika.

"Najprej hočem zvedeti sentiment naroda in preračunati, če imam sploh priliko biti nominiran," je rekel Taft časniki.

Voditelji v Ohio trdijo, da ima Taft že zdaj zagotovljenih 290 glasov na konvenciji, kar je manj kot polovica, kolikor jih potrebuje za nominacijo.

Taft je rekel, da bo šel najprej v Kanado na oddih, potem bo pa potoval po deželi, da otipa v raznih državah pri republikanskih voditeljih, če bi bil sprejet za kandidata.

Anglija bo zahtevala več ur dela od delavcev

London. — Angleška delavska vlada namerava zmanjšati svojo armado v Nemčiji, vzeti vse svoje vojaštvo iz Italije in Grčije, znižati življenjski standard ter zahtevati od delavcev v glavnih industrijah več ur dela na teden.

Premier Attlee je povedal parlamentu, da so te odredbe potrebne, če se hoče odvrniti ekonomski polom v deželi. O vsem tem bo Attlee govoril na rodu po radiu na 10. avgusta.

Attlee se je že sestal z voditelji unijskih premogarjev ter zahteval, naj premogarji delajo vsak dan eno uro več, za kar bodo plačani čas in pol.

Unijskim uradnikom znižana kazen

Milwaukee, Wis. — 26 unijskim članom je bila znižana kazen od 5 mesecev na 60 dni. Bili so obsojeni radi izgrediv pri Allis-Chalmers Co.

V AMERIKI IMAMO KAR 92,348 LETAL

Washington. — Civilna letalska administracija poroča, da je danes v Ameriki registriranih 92,348 letal. Prošlo leto jih je bilo 52,899.

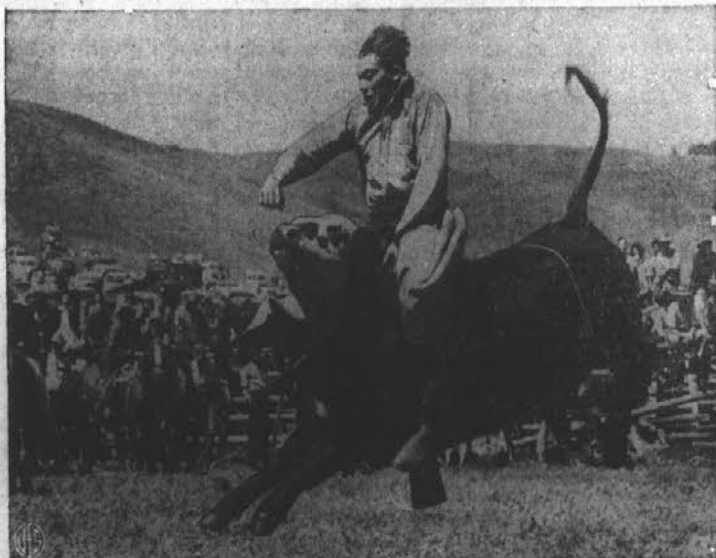

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Povojna Evropa

Procedure v Evropi so blazne in uničevalne. One reprezentirajo to, kar mislijo njihovi blazni vladarji in despoti, da je dobro zanje, kar je usodna napaka. Velike kontinentalne pokrajine so danes v večjem brezupju in večji mizeriji kakor so bile za časa vojne. Položaj Zedinjenih držav v tem svetovnem kaosu je najčudovitejši izmed vseh ostalih položajev, to pa zato, ker Zed. države niso tat v družbi tatov ter se v tej zmešnjavi ne udeležujejo za profit, temveč v svojo izgubo zaradi svojih dobrih namenov.

Se nikoli v povojni zgodovini ni bil noben mir tako nevaren kakor je sedanj. Človeku je prav lahko razumeti čustva, s katerimi so zmagovalci sprejeli predajo Nemčije. Pod groznim in neusmiljenim voditeljem, katerega je milijone ljudi njegovega lastnega kova oboževalo, je nudila Nemčija primer neusmiljenosti, ki je tirala v blaznost njene žrtve. Nobeno čudo torej, da so si ti nesrečniki prizadevali raztrgati svoje tlačitelje na drobne kose, kadar koli in kjer koli se jim je nudila prilika za to. Ampak če bo to naziranje večno prevladovalo, Evropa ne bo mogla živeti, ker to je naziranje in zakon džungle.

Pozabljati se ne sme, da utegne Nemčija v kaki bodoči generaciji postati zopet velesila. Sedanji uničevalci evropske ekonomije ne bodo mogli tega preprečiti z nobenimi odredbami, ki se jih zdaj poslužujejo. Tudi z zaseganjem ozemlja in naravnih pridobitvenih virov ne bo mogoče narediti nemške servilnosti ali hlapičevanja zgodovinsko dolgega. Za to je namreč vse preveč Nemcev. In med njimi je vse preveč znanstva in tehnične vede. Zmagovalci ne morejo do tal podreti ter z zemljo izravnati vse nemške bodočnosti, dasi store lahko mnogo pri odločevanju njene usmerjenosti. Možno je, da pride Nemčija popolnoma pod območje Rusije. V tem slučaju bi postala Evropa žrtev kombinacije azijske divjosti ter nemške filozofije sebičnosti in bi bila vladana iz Moskve.

(Ono nedeljo je Drew Pearson, znani radijski komentator, izjavil na radiju, da je v miselnosti vseh Nemcev zdaj v prvi vrsti sramotni poraz v zadnji vojni ter želja po masčevanju. Zato se Nemci ne bodo zvezali z zapadnimi državami, temveč z Rusijo, ker slednjo manj sovražijo kot zapadne države. Torej je bojazen zapadnih držav tem bolj upravičena in utemeljena).

Pohlepnost v želji po masčevanju je morda čisto naraven pojav v sedanji situaciji. Toda kljub temu to niso činitelji ekonomske obnove ali tega, kar imenujemo in poznamo pod oznako civilizacija.

Brez Nemčije se pohoda Rusije v Evropi ne bo moglo zastaviti. Ko je Hitler pričel svoje blazno divjanje napram svojim sosedom, sta se dve velesili Velika Britanija in Francija uprli njegovemu divjanju, pa tudi manjše države so bile tedaj primeroma močne. Toda videli smo, da se je vse to izkazalo kot prešibko napram Hitlerju. Proti sovjetskim zavojevalcem, ki vidijo zdaj svojo zlato priliko za nadvlado sveta, pa ni danes nobene obrambe. Oni se danes smatrajo — in ne brez vzroka! — da stoje na pragu marksističnih sanj o supremaciji ali nadvladi sveta.

Nobene opravičbe ni za milo in opravičujoče gledanje na namene sovjetov. To je država prisilnega dela z ogromnimi potencialnostmi ali zmognostmi. Sovjeti morejo producirati ne samo potrebna živila, temveč tudi potrebne industrije. Kot dežela s totalitarnimi merami in odredbami, ki lahko poljubno regimentira delavstvo in vse ostalo ljudstvo, lahko lažje prenese prihodnji ekonomski pretres kakor ostali svet. Trdnega uverjenja sovjetskih močitev, da je tak ekonomski pretres na potu, ne gre lahko in mimogrede jemati. Ako ameriško ljudstvo izgubi zaupanje v svoj denar, bo propad sveta popoln in revolucionarnemu komunizmu bodo odprte vse poti v svet.

Naš predsednik Truman ter naš državni department si prizadevata zaustaviti to prodiranje z ameriški dolarji. To da tudi če bi bili ti dolarji na razpolago brez škode za ljudstvo, ki jih mora dajati, se te vidne nesreče ne more ustaviti, dočim je centralna Evropa ekonomska razvalina.

Svet je že razklan na dvoje, kar ni danes menda nikomere več nobena tajnost. Edina iluzija, ki še preostaja, je ta, da bo z ameriški dolarji spet mogoče ta svet zgnesti v celoto, kar pa je usodopolna zmot.

Edino orožje proti tej nevarnosti je ljudska zavednost in zavest nevarnosti, ki preti od te strani. Komunisti so prevečanci ter navadno odločno zanikajo, da so res to, kar so. V vsaki debati se poslužujejo svojih znanih fraz o "ustavnih paravicah," o "demokraciji," "svobodi tiska in govora" itd., torej o samih pravicah in svobodah, o katerih ni v državah, ki jim oni vladajo, ne sluha ne duha! ...

Pionirji Slovenske zadrugne zveze

(Kratek pregled zgodovine in napredka SZZ)

Cleveland, O. — Minilo je 34 let odkar smo ustanovili Slovensko zadrugno zvezo. Leta 1913 in sicer 12. julija je bila odprta prva prodajalna na 152. cesti, katero smo vodili dve leti v istih prostorih. Bili so hudi časi, ker smo imeli dosti nasprotnikov, naši uposleni pa še niso imeli potrebnih izkušenj. 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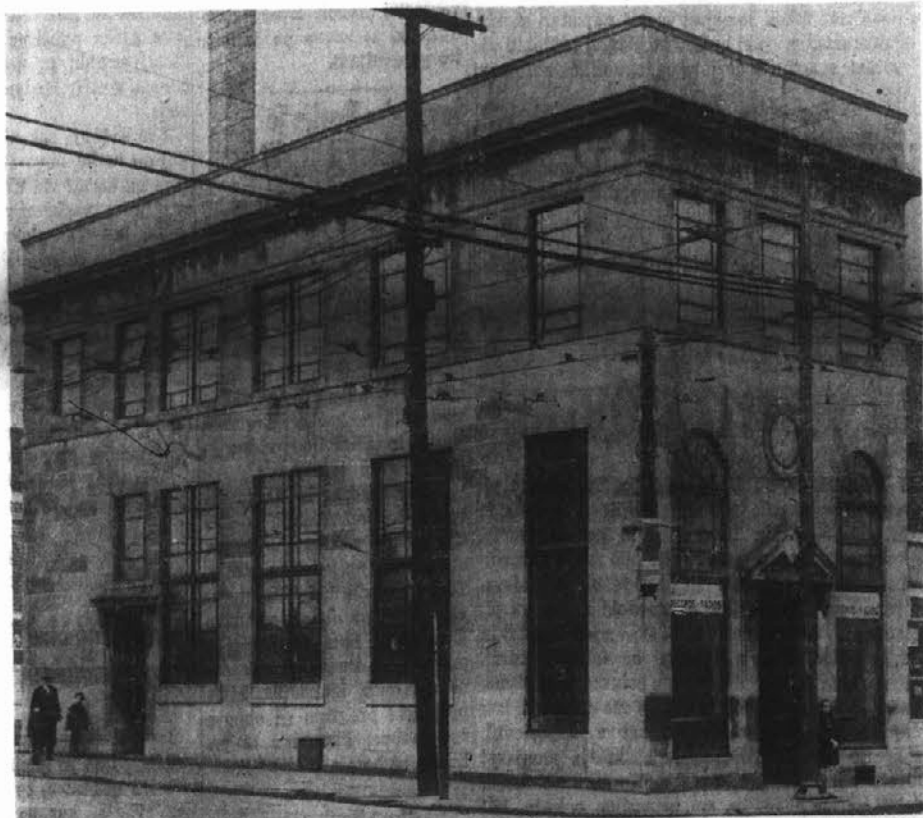

American with Bulldozer Hunts Captain Kidd's Hoard

MAHON Bay, N. S. — An American with a bulldozer sought today to hit a possible buried treasure jackpot which has eluded generations of pick-and-shovel wielders.

Since 1795, treasure hunters have probed the earth of tiny Oak Island for the fabulous buried Silver cache of Captain Kidd. Now Jacob Faulkenham, Andover, Maine, lumberman, is employing a bulldozer in a new search.

And later in the summer Edward Reichart of New York is expected to turn up with a technical crew, bulldozers, and other heavy equipment. Reichart recently made a survey of the island — a dot of land one mile long and a half mile wide in the bay which once was the haunt of pirates — and said he would be back later.

Captain Kidd, according to local records, was a frequent visitor to this part of Nova Scotia. He was arrested in Boston in 1699 and hanged in London in 1701. Many pirates used the bay as a headquarters. The name Mahone comes from a French word for a pirate craft.

he Oak Island story began in 1795. Three young men found a great oak there, with marks on a branch indicating a block and tackle had been fastened to it. Underneath was a depression in the grass 13 feet in diameter. They started digging.

Ten feet down was a layer of oak planks. Ten feet farther, a second oak layer; at 30 feet, a third. The work was too tiresome for the trio, and digging was stopped. Six years later a company was organized, and the hole was extended to 90 feet, each 10 feet disclosing a protective layer — one of charcoal, another of putty.

At 95 feet, they found a flat stone bearing a curious inscription. Some said it read: "Ten feet below, two million pounds lies buried." The diggers hit a solid wooden platform, and then an overnight flood filled the pit with water. They sank another shaft, but water seeped into it from the first.

Half a century later, another expedition sent a boring apparatus into the water. The bore went through the platform and some metal, 22 inches deep. The effort undermined the bottom of the shaft, and mud and water covered the "treasure."

In 1896 there was another try. Twenty shafts were sunk. In 1913 water defeated another enterprise. Four other expeditions, including a costly one last year, also failed.

Beach Erosion

By WILLIAM M. BOYD

The Lake Erie shore line gives evidence of becoming a tremendous problem as far as erosion is concerned due to present high water stages and the present stage of development of the shore line.

The south shore of Lake Erie is unstable, being composed chiefly of unconsolidated materials. Only six per cent of the Ohio shore line is composed of erosion resistant rocks.

West of Cleveland to beyond Lorain there is much shale along the shore. Shale is readily eroded and the shore line is receding. West of Lorain County the shore cliffs disappear, its place being taken by the Cedar Point sand spit. The Marblehead peninsula has limestone cliffs of various heights but is erodible as limestone is more or less soluble in water.

From Port Clinton west, there are no rock outcrops and the shore is clay. At some spots in Lucas and Ottawa Counties no shore cliff exists, but barrier beaches have formed back of which are extensive marshes.

The shoreline east of Cleveland to the Ohio-Pennsylvania boundary is chiefly composed of glacial drift which at places is precipitous with walls rising to 60 feet. Erosion is severe in this section.

According to state records which have been accumulated over a period of years, about 9 million dollars worth of property has already been lost. The annual damage by counties, except for Cuyahoga County, for which records are not available, is as follows:

Lucas	\$30,000
Ottawa	5,000
Erie	78,000
Lorain	180,000
Lake	106,000
Ashtabula	48,000

Past construction of structures to alleviate beach erosion on Lake Erie has been haphazard and mainly as a result of individual enterprise. Results have not been too happy and many structures have lasted for only a few years, if that long.

The need for detailed and accurate information on the past and present conditions before recommending any protective works has not been fully realized by beach property owners. Definite answers must be available on all questions of design. Each locality presents a new problem. It is inadvisable to prescribe a particular plan of protection of a beach simply because it worked elsewhere. An orderly method of procedure must be followed to assure consideration of all relevant information.

There is a continually increasing demand for beach protection. Lake shore resorts have been growing rapidly and there is an immense investment in them. The development of good roads and automobiles has been the major factor in the development of resorts and private beach communities and making them available to citizens of the entire state.

Ohio is unfortunate in that there is no abundant source of sand along the lake that would tend to build up the beaches. The rocks exposed along the shore are mainly shales with a little limestone and upon disintegration do not furnish much sand. The glacial till is mainly clay and only has about 10 per cent of material that goes to form beaches. As a result of this condition, Ohio beaches are small, thin, and widely separated. Largest sand deposits are of course at the western end of the lake near Sandusky and west thereof.

The annual damage of about \$450,000 would justify expenditures of about \$11,000,000 based on almost any system of economic analysis. The city of Cleveland should plan for the development of a large part of its waterfront for recreational purposes. Its development should ultimately consist of parks, beaches, small craft basins, and even a seaplane base. Developments such as Cleveland's will be followed by similar developments at other Ohio Lake Erie cities. Availability of adequate beaches plays a large part in such developments and shore erosion must be controlled.

The Federal government has not yet seen fit to participate in beach erosion construction unless a federal interest is involved. At the present time, in order to have a federal interest, there must be federal property in question. In other words, at places where Federal harbors are located or other federally owned property is involved. Until such time as Federal legislation is passed providing for federal participation in beach erosion work on a general basis, the only assistance possible from the federal government is THAT limited to the cooperative surveys.

Beach erosion planning must of necessity be of long range nature due to the costly type of work involved and the amount of work required on a shore line of 185 miles. Planning should be of an evolutionary nature such that it can be extended as considered desirable.

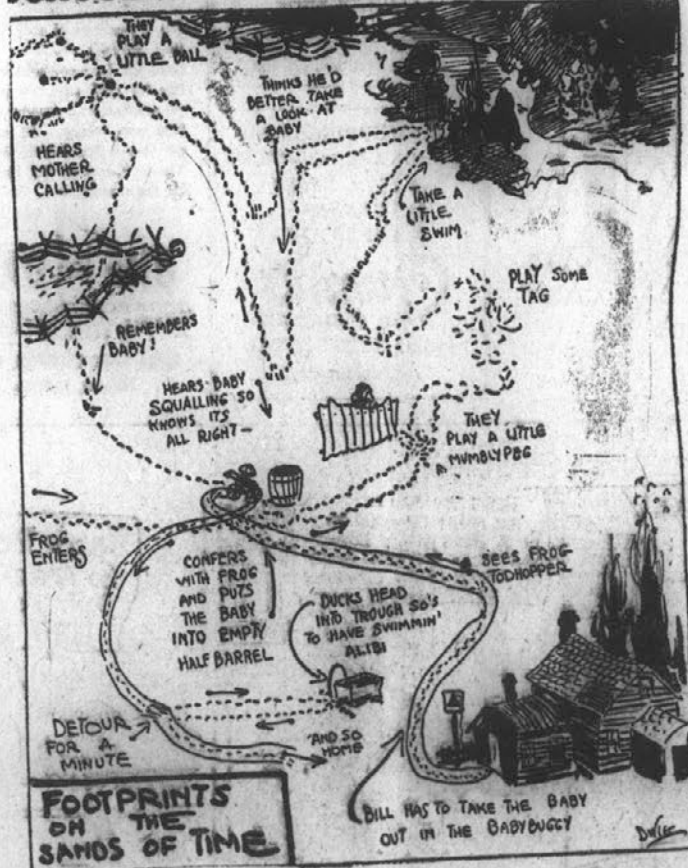

Leaning Tower Of Pisa Slants More and More

\$1,600,000 Estimated Cost of Reinforcing Its Base; No Danger of Collapse
Pisa, Italy, July 5. — This city's six-hundred-year-old Leaning Tower, one of the wonders of the world, is in need of a one-million dollar foundation reinforcement, a project of the Pisa city engineers disclosed. The tower will have to wait at least "five or six years," however, while Pisa attends to several hundred war repair jobs of greater urgency.

The Leaning Tower is moving more out of line every year, Ranieri Noccioli, one of the officials of the Pisa city engineering department, explained. Before the war, one thousand tons of cement was placed under the tower in an attempt to steady it, but at least another ten thousand tons are necessary, he estimated.

A wait of half a decade will do the tower no harm, however. The increase in its angle of inclination is only one twenty-fifth of an inch a year. At this rate it would take "several centuries," and possibly as much as two thousand years before it keeled over.

Foundation Slipping
The fact that the tower is moving has been known for more than a generation. It's clay foundation, a few feet above the sea level, was always weak. In recent years it has begun to crumble and slip under the tower's unevenly distributed pressure. The project which the Pisa engineers have in mind would put a cement floor 20 feet deep and 120 feet wide under the tower.

The pre-war project merely succeeded in cutting off some of the water which was washing at the tower's underpinnings, Mr. Noccioli said.

During the war, Pisa's engineers were worried that one of the many bombs which fell on their city might crash close to the tower at the risk toward which it leans. The tower's balance is so delicate that such a blast could have knocked it down. The tower was hit a half dozen times by shells and flak but all were glancing blows which did no structural harm. One of the columns which surround the tower was knocked out and one of a score of bells on the roof was destroyed.

None of the tower's war damage has been repaired. The estimated cost of the restoration is \$2,000. It may be possible to get around to it in another six months, according to Alberto Chelli, who directs the tower's maintenance.

Heise Family Opens Unique Clinic

Winona, Minn. — A father and his five sons hung their physicians' and surgeons' shingles on a \$1,000,000 clinic. The Heise family of doctors, unique in America because they all are practicing, offered the services of six specialists to the community. The father, Dr. William F. G. Heise, has been a physician and surgeon here since 1883 and will direct the new clinic.

His sons are specialists in surgery, pediatrics, obstetrics and gynecology, pathology and surgery and ear, nose and throat diseases.
