"Lopov!" vzklikne še enkrat mladi knez. "Napadaš slabo ženo, ali hočem te dobiti kljub mojim verigam, hočem..."

Glas je zamrl na ustnicah mladega Poljaka. Tridesetorica rok ga pograbi in vrže ob tla, petnajstotica bičev zazvižga po zraku trgajoči kožo nesrečneža. Knez naredi nekoliko obupnih kretanj, da se ubrani; ali kmalu je ležal ves krvav in nezavest na zemlji.

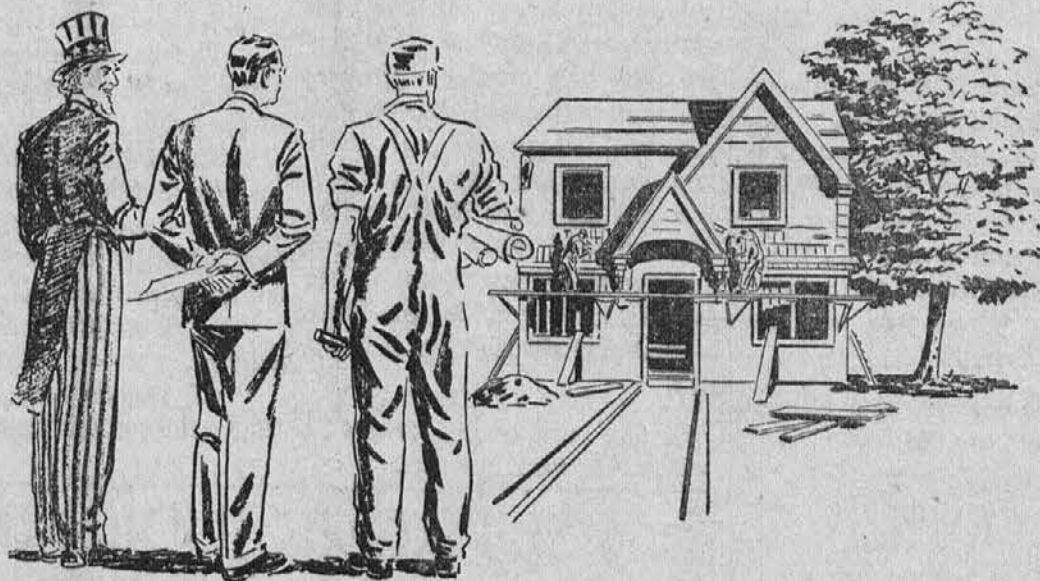

SDZ JUNIOR BASEBALL LEAGUE

FORMED; START SATURDAY, JUNE 18

At the important meeting that was held Thursday, June 2, representatives from the Cavaliers, Cadets of the Little Flower, SDZ Knights, SDZ Buds, Busy Bees, Junior Workers, High Flyers, and Royal Comrades, got down to brass tacks and formed the first juvenile baseball league in the history of Cleveland fraternals.

The teams will play Saturday mornings or afternoons, and will be run off in two divisions. Teams from Garfield Heights and Newburg will play among themselves. Of the four teams entered there, a champion shall be declared. Their champion shall meet the ruler of the Collinwood-Euclid-St. Clair district in a best out of three series. The former district shall be known as the Southern division while the latter will be known as the Northern division.

Teams entered from the South end are: Cadets of the

Little Flower, Knights, Buds and Busy Bees. In the Northern division are entered the following: Cavaliers, High Flyers, Junior Workers and Royal Comrades.

Official play will get under way Saturday, June 18. Each group will complete 2 rounds of play before entering their championship play. The pitching distance will be 35 feet with the bases at 60 feet. Two balls will be put into play each Saturday in the respective divisions, with the winners receiving one ball on completion of the two games each Saturday.

The girls will also compete for the SDZ Junior Girls' Baseball crown, but under a different system. Since there are three teams from the South end and three from the North end this will necessitate inter-district competition throughout the summer. The girls will travel back and forth for their games.

Entered in the girls' division are the Buds, Cadets of the Little Flower and Knights, these from the South end. From the North end are the Junior Workers, Cavaliers and Royal Comrades. The pitching distance in the girls' division will be 30 feet with 50 foot bases. And fast pitching

will rule in both the boys' and the girls' divisions. The 12-inch baseball will also be used in both divisions.

The leagues are open to juveniles who are in the juvenile department of SDZ. They also must be members on or before June 15. Girls will be allowed to join up to July 1.

Managers of teams will present their rosters consisting of 15 players preceding their first games. Awards will also be given the champions. Martin Orehevec will be in complete charge of the South end division while Rudy Lokar will do likewise in the North end.
