**Anglija je postala preobljudena. Izseljevanje je potrebno**

**Zanimive vesti iz življenja naših ljudi po ameriških naselbinah**

London, 19. julija. Radi znanje svetovne depresije, so se začeli Anglezi iz vseh krajev sveta vrati v Anglijo dočim je izseljevanje skoropopoloma prenehalo. To je vzrok, da je Anglija danes postala najbolj gostu našljena dežela na svetu. Glasom statističnih podatkov pride danes v Angliji 734 oseb na kvadratno miljo prostora, dočim pride na Japonskem samo 433 oseb. V nasprotni s tem pa angleške kolonije zelo redko naseljene in bi prav lahko prevzele več milijonov Angležev kot naseljev. Da se vidi, kako so Angleži v Angliji gostu našljeni, naj navedemo, da prideti v Kanadi n. pr. samo dve osebi na kvadratno miljo zemlje, v Avstraliji enako, v Zedinjenih državah 41, v Argentini pa devet oseb, dočim jih pride v Angliji 734. Zopet naseljevanje v Angliji se je pričelo leta 1930, tako da je danes v Angliji 50,000 oseb več, kot jih se je na zadnjih 18 mesecih izselilo. Danes se nahaja v Angliji 44,790,458 prebivalcev, in izmed teh jih je najmanj 3,000,000 pripravljenih se takoj izseliti, kakor hitro so angleške kolonije pripravljene zopet odpreti svoja vrata. Dne 21. julija se prične v Ottawi, glavnem mestu Kanade, konferenca vseh zastopnikov vseh angleških domov, in pri tej konferenci se bo zlesti razpravljalo, kako praviti angleške kolonije za angleške izseljence.

## Zanimivo izvestje.

Zadnjici smo omenili nekaj zanimivih številk iz poročila glavnega predsednika Hrvatske Bratske Zajednice glede bolniške podpore. Bolniška podpora pri naših bratskih organizacijah ni bila nikdar dobičkanosna, vedno predmet hude debat na konvencijah, vedno največja skrb glavnim odborom. Edina izjema v tem je Slovenska Dobrodelna Zveza v Clevelandu, ki šteje danes nad \$200,000 v bolniškem skladu, dasi plačuje primeroma višjo podporo in to za nizji asesment, kot pri drugih bratskih organizacijah. In pri tem v vseh enaindvajsetih letih ni bil še enkrat razpisani izvredni asesment. Zadostoval je ves čas redni asesment.

Prvotno so naše bratske podporne organizacije plačevale samo smrtninsko in deloma odškodninsko podporo, a bolezenska podpora je bila pripisana društvi. Ta navada je bila upeljana pri vseh naših organizacijah. Kolikor mi vemo, so društva vedno priljubno shajala s svojim asesmentom in so točno plačevala podporo, vsako samo za sebe. In ker je šel denar iz društvene blagajne, so seveda društveni uradniki in člani strogo pazili, da so dobivali podporo le v resnicni bolni člani, in skrajno redek je bil slučaj, da je pod poro dobival simulant.

Pozneje pa so se začela ustanavljati manjša društva po raznih naselbinah. Stotine takih društev se je ustanovilo, ki so štela in še danes štejejo od 10 do 25 članov. Ta društva enostavno niso zmogla lastne bolniške podpore. Vsi člani skupaj so na mesec plačali od \$10.00 do \$30.00 v bolniško blagajno, na leto do \$300.00. Toda naj je zbolel en sam član, pa je šla vsa blagajna, ne da bi govorili o treh ali petih bolnikih.

Tako je polagoma začela govorica o centralni podpori, da bi namreč Jednota začela plačevati bolniško podporo. In v resnicni so razne konvencije posameznih Jednot ena za drugo začele sprejemati določila za centralno bolniško podporo. Zdi se nam, da ravno od tedaj se je začelo simuliranje, zmanjšala se je kontrola, bolniki so bili bolj številni, zlasti ob slabih časih. Vprašajte društvene uradnike, društvene ali vrhovne zdravnike, vsi bodo potrdili to.

Ni čuda, da so začele bolniške blagajne hirati, zlasti pa one, iz katerih se je plačevalo po \$3.00 ali več dnevne bolniške podpore. Danes ne vemo, če je še kje pri kaki naši bratski organizaciji bolniški sklad, iz katerega bi se dobivalo po \$3.00 na dan podpore. Glavni odbori so pregnali take člane od te blagajne s tem, da so razpisali tako visoke asesmente, da je član moral pustiti. Asesment pa je moral biti razpisani v taki visokosti, ker je bila blagajna enostavno prazna, bolniki so se pa še vedno oglaševali. Tudi po našem mnenju je \$2.00 dnevne bolniške podpore dovolj. S tem se lahko plačuje zdravnik in zdravila in nekatere malenkosti.

Tudi dvadolarska dnevna bolniška podpora ne uspeva pri mnogih organizacijah. Tako na primer je neka bratska organizacija še pred kratkim razpisala v ta sklad \$35.00 izvanrednega mesečnega asesmenta na vsakega člana v dvadolarski bolniški sklad. Očividno je, da takega asesmenta ne more nihče plačati, in dvadolarski sklad je bil s tem odpravljen.

Izjemo tvori dvadolarski sklad pri Slovenski Dobrodelni Zvezi, med vsemi drugimi bratskimi organizacijami. Že zadnja tri leta se opazuje, da dvadolarski bolniški sklad pri Slovenski Dobrodelni Zvezi bolj napreduje, kot endolarski sklad, in to je izjema med vsemi drugimi našimi organizacijami. **Odgovor:** Permit ni potreben za ljudi, nastanjene v Združenih državah, ki gredo v Kanado. Ali če kdo ima čas, da zaprosi zanj, stori najboljše, ako ga ima, kajti permit je najboljši dokaz legalnega bivanja v Združenih državah. Priseljenški nadzorniki vprašujejo vsakega človeka, ki se vrača iz Kanade, naj dokaže svoje bivanje v Združenih državah. Pismena izjava de-jodajalca, bančna knjiga, davčna potrdila, najeminske pobotnice itd utegnejno biti zadostne, da se dokaže bivanje v Združenih državah. Ali priseljenški inspektor utegne vprašati za dodaten dokaz, da je bil povračajoči se in ozemelj zakonito pripuščen v Združene države. Oni, ki so bili pripuščeni od leta 1928 naprej, storijo najboljše, ako imajo s seboj "Immigrant Identification Card," ki so jo dobili od priseljenške oblasti ob svojem prihodu. Oni, ki so zaprosili za registracijo, naj pokažejo svojo "Registration Card."

**Odgovor:** Vložite prošnjo za izdanie duplikata pri najblžjem naturalizacijskem uradu. V tiskovini (Form 2600) navedite vse potrebne podatke, ki se jih spominjate. Treba je prošnji priložiti pristojbino od \$10 (potom Money Ordre). Ako ti podatki niso zadostni, utegnete čakati precej dolgo na duplikat. Ako naturalizacijska oblast ne bi mogla najti zapisa naturalizacije, se vam pristojbina ne povrne. Vsakdo pametno ravna, ako si kam zapiše številko prvega ozira drugega papirja, tako da se dokument zgubi, človek lahko najde vsaj številko in datum.

**Važno za one, ki so prišli v Ameriko pred letom 1906**

**Vprašanje:** Prišel sem v Ameriko kot otrok l. 1905 in nikakor se ne morem spominjati, kdaj sem prišel in kako. Poskušil sem dozvedeti na razne načine, ali dosedaj brez uspeha. Reklo sem mi je, da edina pomoč je registracija. Ali je zares treba vse teh izdatkov in zamude?

**Odgovor:** Dosedaj je bilo to potrebno. Ali kongres je pred kratkim sprejel nov zakon, po katerem vse oni, ki so prišli v Združene države pred dnem 29. junija 1906 ne potrebujejo takozvanega spričevala prihoda (certificate of arrival), kadar zaprosijo za naturalizacijske papirje. Zato vsi oni, ki so prišli pred zgornjim datumom, pa ne znajo natančno kdaj, smo se sedaj zaprositi za papirje brez daljne sitnosti.

**Nepretrgano bivanje v Združenih državah**

**Vprašanje:** Živel sem v Združenih državah od 1. 1914 naprej. Pred tremi leti sem si vzel državljanški papir. Lani sem šel na obisk v starji kraj s permitom in ostal sem tam štiri mesece. Ali bo ta odsotnost v starem kraju povzročila mi sitnosti, ko zakon zahteva petletno nepretrgano bivanje pred naturalizacijo?

**Odgovor:** Brez drugega vložiti prošnjo za prvi papir. Kratka odsotnost iz Združenih držav ne pretgraje bivanja. Le ako

imate v mislih, pooblašča tajnika dela (Secretary of Labor), da sme dovoliti osebam, ki so bile deportirane, da smejo zaposliti za pripustitev v Združene države. Zakon poudarja, da se to sme dovoliti le osebam "dobrega moralnega značaja." Nikakor pa ni mogoč povratek pred pretekom enega leta po deportaciji.

Ako je bil vzrok le tehnična prekršitev priseljenškega zakona ali kaka telesna slabost, ki je bila med tem opravljena, ali celo nezakonit prihod v Združene države ob olajšujočimi okolnostmi (kot radi želje da pride k možu, očetu itd.), se bržkone dovoli prošnja za pripustitev. Na drugi strani, ako je bil kdo deportiran radi kriminalnosti ali kakega težkega vzroka, se to ne bo dovolilo. F. L. I. S.


