v bližini Dresdena.

Eden je povedal v poslanski
zbornici, da je vprizorilo beg 76

častnikov. Pet najstnijih so jih naci-

ji živih, 14 jih pa še niso ujeti.

Nekaj so jih naciji na mestu

ustrelili, ker so se zoperstavljal

aretaciji, nekaj pa potem, ko so

jih prijeli in so poskušali ponovno

ubežati.

CONDENSED NEWS FROM OUR HOME FRONT

Cleveland, Ohio

Sat., May 20, 1944

Selective Service officials have given out a new ruling, deferring all men over 30 who perform essential work, and also those over 26 who are essential in defense work.

Attorney General Herbert, who lost the Republican nomination for governor, has demanded of Secretary of State that all ballots be impounded in Scioto County and re-counted.

Burglars broke into the City Hall in Painesville, smashed open the safe, ransacked two offices and taking \$5,000 in cash and checks, which had been paid in for municipal utilities.

Elizabeth Smrdel of 1228 E. 167 St. is convalescing in Glenville Hospital. Mrs. Stoilev of 6712 Bonita Ave. underwent an operation at St. John's Hospital. We wish both a speedy recovery.

Kinsman School, 7805 Kinsman Rd. suffered a blitzkrieg last week, in which papers were piled in a heap, pictures, clocks and mirrors were ripped from the walls and broken on the floor. There were obscene writings on the walls and on the board—the American flag was splashed with ink as well as the desks. The hoodlums are unknown.

Mr. and Mrs. Anton Bartol, formerly in the grocery business, have now taken over the cafe of Joe Starin, at 689 E. 200 St.

Thomas Faust, milk distributor in Eaton, O., took Draft Board member Dr. C. D. Turney for a ride, driving 120 miles out, hoping to prove to him that he was indispensable to the milk industry. Result: A sentence in jail, and then the army uniform.

John Potokar, owner of the Double Eagle Bottling Co., celebrated his 70th birthday on May 12. He is well known as a philanthropist, having an open heart for everything that will help humanity and contributing generously.

The first interview given to the Associated Press for the American Press by Marshal Josip Broz (Tito) has been stopped by the censors of the Allied Mediterranean Command, in spite of assurances that there would be no censorship in the Mediterranean. No reason has been given.

The City Transit Board granted pay increases to all employees, giving two cents an hour increases to operators of two-man street cars, and five cents an hour to one-man car operators, and equivalent increases to office workers. The union is not satisfied with these increases and a strike vote was taken.

The 18th annual convention of the Cleveland

Diocesan Council of Catholic Women was opened Saturday with a banquet at Cleveland Hotel, at which five bishops were present and Mayor Frank J. Lausche. A program presented 14 groups in national costumes. The Slovenian group was represented by Dorothy Petrinic, Mary Sajovec, Agnes Kosec and Milde Erberznik of the Barga Glee Club.

Beginning June 17, the boat Theodore Roosevelt, which will make trips between Cleveland and Cedar Point, will stop once a week in Lorain, to pick up passengers. The boat will stop every Friday, beginning June 23.

Across the continent in six hours, 31 minutes and 30 seconds, is the record of the P-51 Mustang, piloted by Colonel Peterson of the U. S. Army, who made the trip from Los Angeles to New York.

The well-known John Paulich owner of a cafe and restaurant at 5238 St. Clair Ave. celebrated his 60th birthday on Tuesday, May 16.

A four-motor bomber flew from the airport at Sioux City, across two states, and after four hours in the air, being empty, hit the ground over 100 miles away from where the crew parachuted down, after a fire started in the plane. Eventually the fire burned out by itself and the bomber went on its way.

Rev. George Sheahan, chancellor at Springfield Mass., announced that the suspension of Rev Stanislaus Orleman in a skunk has been recalled by Bishop O'Leary after receiving a letter of apology.

Frank Stemberger of 8613 Rosewood Ave. suffered a broken rib, after a fall last Saturday, and is now at home under a doctor's care. We wish him a speedy recovery.

Beware boys! Here come the girls! Lt. Colonel Jane Clement, director of 3,000 Army nurses in the Southwest Pacific, reports that an average of four nurses a day are being married to the men on the front lines, and with the Australian girls grabbing some more, there will be a shortage on the home front.

Police and the OPA are investigating the theft of gasoline ration coupons from Ration Board 6, amounting to 55,000 gallons of gasoline although Police Inspector Story states that coupons amounting to at least a million gallons went to the black market. Being questioned is Chief Clerk Robert Disauer, 1551 E. 32 St., who has been active in politics in Ward 10.

Celebrating his 52nd Namesday in America, 76 year old John Hrovat of 6713 Edna Ave. left Tuesday for Debevec's farm in Madison, Ohio.

Congratulations to Mr. and Mrs. John Prusnik of 684 E. 160 St. for their 40th wedding anniversary.

President Roosevelt is the first man in American history, who is sure

of being renominated for a fourth term if he wishes it. The Democratic convention will be held in Chicago, July 19, with 1,176 delegates attending and 589 needed for nomination. He president has 877 pledged, 88 more than necessary.

The Slovenian Democratic Club of Euclid endorsed the complete Democratic ticket. They also accepted Senator Wm. M. Boyd as an honorary member, and elected Mike Bole as assistant secretary. The members promised to get on the job for the coming elections, especially to register as many voters as possible.

With the Briggs Mfg Co. of Detroit going on strike on Tuesday, because of lack of supervision, all foremen being on strike, this brought the total number of 64,000 workers out of work.
