SMRT BEGUNSKEGA DUHONVIKA. — S Tirolskega poročajo, da je na Veliki četrtek smrtno ponesrečil begunski duhovnik Anton Skubic, do leta 1945. župnik v Gorenjem Logatcu. O nesreči poročajo sledete: Bivši župnik Skubic je bil sedaj beneficijat na mali duhovniji Freiberg nad dolino Vintschgau zapadno od Merana na Tirolskem. Tam je bival s svojo 83 let staro materjo in s svojo sestro, ki mu je gospodinjila. Na Veliki četrtek se je podal v dolino k cerkvenim obredom v glavno župno cerkev v dolini, v Latsch. Po opravljenih obredih Velikega četrtnika se je podal še v Tarsch, odkoder se je odpavil domov okrog petih popoldne. Čutiti se je slabega, zato ga je domač fant hotel spremljati na poti v hrib. Skubic je to odklonil in se podal sam po bližnici na Freiberg. Fant je klub temu řel za njim toliko časa, da je gospod prešel najbolj nevarno mesto, potem se je vrnil. Na Veliki petek je neka žena zgodaj zjutraj našla na poti beneficijatovo palico in zaslužila nesrečo. Hitela je obvestit ljudi, ki so kmalu našli pod 200 metrov globoko pečino Skubica mrtvega. Sklepajo, da mu je po poti prišlo slabo in je v tem padel po strmini. Boljšai je na želodeu in mu je prišlo večkrat slabo. Doma niso bili vznemirjeni, da ga zvečer ni bil domov, ker je itak bil namejen za obrede Velikega petka spet v dolino in so upravičeno misili, da je pač raje kar ostal v dolini.

Pogreb ranjkega je bil na Veliki pondeljak popoldne v Taršu. Ob pogrebu se je pokazalo, kako je bil ranjki priljubljen.

Poslanska zbornica je dala za obrambo več kot Truman

Zbornica zahteva 70 letalskih skupin, Truman jih priporoča le 55

Washington. — Poslanska zbornica vidi večjo potrebo za obrambo dežele, kot pa predsednik Truman. Zato je včeraj odglasovala za \$3,198,100,000 za ojačanje letalske sile ter ukazala, da začne vladu takoj organizirati 70 letalskih skupin.

Predsednik Truman je vpravjal kongres za nekaj več denarja, toda ne za toliko, kolikor je odglasovala poslanska zbornica. Truman je tudi priporočal, da se organizira le 55 novih letalskih skupin, kar se je zdelo poslancem mnogo prema.

Poslanska zbornica je posušala nasvet tajnika letalske sile, Symingtona, ki je trdil preko glave predsednika Trumana, da je potreba takoj organizirati 70 letalskih skupin, če hočemo imeti dovolj močne obrambo za deželo. Zato je zbornica brez vsakega cincanja dala za letalsko silo \$822,000,000 več, kot je priporočal Truman in ubogala Symingtona za število letalskih skupin. Poslanci so glasovali z 343 glasovi za, proti samo 3. Slednji trije so komunističnih nagibanj.

Voditelji v poslanski zbornici pravijo, da bo senat sledil in odbril ta predlog.

Po tem predlogu bo dobila naša letalska sila v prihodnjih 4 letih 20,500 najmodernejših letal, dočim jih je predsednik Truman priporočal le 14,000.

Rusi so izolirali letalsko bazo Tullin pri Dunaju

Dunaj. — Ruske vojaške oblasti so izolirale ameriško letalsko bazo Tullin, 14 milij zapadno od Dunaja. Postavili so stražo na cesto, ki vodi iz Dunaja do baze in zahtevajo od vsakega ameriškega uslužbenca "sive" izkaznice.

Baza se nahaja na ozemlju, ki ga ima okupiranega Rusija in so se že Amerikanci dozdaj lahko posluževali brez vsakih zastrup.

Federalna sodnija je na 3. aprila ukazala Lewisu in njegovi uniji, naj takoj preneha s stavko. John Lewis izjavlja, da ni kriv in da justični oddelek ni dokazal, da je kaj prekršil, ker da on ni pozval premogarjev na stavko in da premogarji faktično niso stavkali, ampak so enostavno ostali od dela doma. Lewis je ukazal premogarjem nazaj na delo v pondeljek, ko je dobil zagotovo, da bodo dobili premogarji pokojnino.

Več kot polovica premogarjev še vedno ni šla nazaj na delo, ker čakajo, kako bo odločil sodnik v zadevi njih predsednika.

London. — Radio iz Moskve je včeraj poročal, da je bil ameriški časnikarski in radijski poročevalci, Robert Magidoff, obtožen vohunstva proti Rusiji in da mu je bilo ukazano, da mora oditi iz Moskve v dveh ali treh dneh.

Iz Moskve dalje poročajo, da je poročevalca zatožila ruskim oblastem njegova tajnika, Cecilia Nelson, rojena v Michiganu. Tajnika je vzela svojemu predsedniku razme dokumente ter jih izročila ruskim oblastem, istočasno pa je seveda odšla iz službe.

Iz dokumentov, ki jih je tajnika izročila ruskim oblastem, je baje razvidno, da je dobil Magidoff iz New Yorka naročila, naj izve in poroča, ako ima Rusija zgrajene tovarne pod zemljo in če so dovolj močne proti zračnim napadom.

McGraw-Hill Publ. Co. in New York, pri kateri je Magidoff v službi, je izjavila, da je svojim dopisovalcem naročila, naj dobitjo take informacije v Angliji, Franciji, Švedski, Češki, Italiji, Nemčiji, Avstriji in Japonski. Od povsod so poslali naročene informacije, toda Magidoff jih v Rusiji ni mogel dobiti in jih torej ni poslal, izjavlja firma.

This and That from Washington

By Congressman Frances P. Bolton

THE President's prompt appointment of Mr. Paul Hoffman to the important position of Administrator of the Recovery Program, is heartening in the extreme. Mr. Hoffman has the confidence of the country and will have its backing. Few men in all history have been given greater responsibility. His is a thrilling and benificent task. All power to him!

Mrs. Bolton

One of the critical matters before him and before us is the question of trade with Russia and the satellite countries. It is a very complicated problem because the ultimate goal of the Recovery Program is the renewal of East-West trade. Objections to the shipment of war material is natural, but should we entirely stop shipping to her she would naturally cut us off as well. Although some insist that the amount of manganese and chrome we get from her is negligible, the figures supplied authoritatively indicate that we are getting 36 percent of our manganese and 47 percent of our chrome import from Russia. In addition to this, an East-West trade rupture in Europe would increase the strain upon the United States as we would be expected to supply what comes currently to Western Europe from Eastern Europe. Surely we can find ways to exclude war materials. What would

WORLD trade should begin to adjust itself if and when the International Trade Organization gets under way. The compromise charter signed in Havana after months of argument pleases no one. Poland and Argentina did not sign; Russia refused to participate.

The charter now goes to the signature countries for confirmation. Actually it does little more than set up a forum in which world trade problems may be discussed, where solutions may be sought in a cooperative spirit. The value of such a consultation court is readily recognized and should be one of the many first steps that must be taken to establish a framework for world peace.

THE extreme seriousness of foot and mouth disease is reflected by H. R. 5098, passed by the House this week. Six times within the past 50 years this dread disease has broken out in the United States with dire consequence. The Committee's report indicates that an outbreak now would result not only in incalculable damage to the live stock industry, but also would undoubtedly work hardship upon city consumers of meat, milk and other live stock products. The bill provides that no live virus may be brought into any part of the mainland of the United States. Experiment and research will be permitted only on coastal islands.

CONDENSED NEWS FROM OUR HOME FRONT

Cleveland, Ohio

Friday, April 16, 1948

Washington.—The Secretary of the Interior reports that the U.S. government has measured off 40 sq. mi. in the southwestern part of Colorado to seek uranium, which is need in atomic energy.

New York.—The Soviet government has complained to Washington that their vessel "Russia" is not allowed to leave New York. The fact is that the owners of the vessel are being sued because two persons received injuries on the last trip and the boat can not leave unless enough money is put up as guarantee if the owners lose the case.

Rome.—The Italian government has an army of 330,000 men ready for any trouble during the April 18th elections. This information was given out so that the citizens would not be afraid to vote as they wish. There will also be 180,000 soldiers who will guard the voting places.

Stopping in Cleveland on his tour with a wheelbarrow, Harry Hightower, 47, of Ellensburg Wash., told that he "drove" 6,494 miles since July 4, 1946, and that he wore out 12 pairs of shoes and 32 pairs of gloves. As a veteran of World War I, he receives a pension of \$55 a month which he uses for his upkeep. The wheelbarrow is made of steel and weighs 104 lbs. He intends to sail for England and will travel all through Europe except Russia.

Found guilty of being a loan shark was Marine De Voogt, 46 years old. About 15 years ago he started to loan money to factory workers, charging 36% interest and if they didn't pay on time, he charged interest on interest. He now has 189 loans out amounting to \$80,000. As the state law doesn't allow a charge of more than 8% and you must have a license for that, the loan shark will most probably lose all the money as he cannot invoke the law to help him collect, if the victims refuse to pay.

Buenos Aires.—There is a shortage of money here because bank employees are out on a strike for 5 days and

banks service has ceased almost entirely.

Washington.—The government refused an offer from the flour mills of 411,910 lbs. of flour because the price was too high. The flour was to have been exported. The government did not repeat what price was quoted.

Minneapolis.—Sgt. Malcolm McCrady will have to answer to his superiors for flying off from Dayton, O., in a B-25 bomber. He went to Owatonna, Minnesota, to visit his brother. His superiors can't figure out how he lifted the plane off the ground all by himself since it requires an ordinary crew of 3 or 5. The Sergeant is serving as a mechanic with the Air Force and has never piloted a bomber or any kind of plane.

Rome.—The government has forbidden all wearing of uniforms except persons in the employ of the government. This will be in effect until April 18th, which is a bitter blow to the Communistic brigades, which paraded in various uniforms over the country.

Washington.—President Truman has given orders that for a 30-day period no government-owned factories may be sold. This was his decision after talking with Secretary Forrestal about U.S. defenses.

Chicago.—A motorist was driving along on his way to Chicago, when he suddenly noticed to his horror that 16 motorcycle police were following him. Slowing down, he saw all of them flying by his car without giving him a glance. He found out later that the 16 police were driving new motorcycles from Milwaukee to Chicago.

Seattle, Wash.—The Coast Guard reports that it noticed 18 floating mines on the northern Pacific coast. Four of them have already exploded. The mines must have loosened from their moorings and now are floating freely on the ocean.

Chicago.—Owners of 6 newspapers offered linotype operators, who are out on strike since Nov. 4th, \$6 more per week, which would make it \$91.50 per week for 38 and 1/2 hours; night shifts would get \$97 a week for a 30-hour week.

Miller Calls for 3-Way Revision of Sales Tax

A threefold revision of the Ohio sales tax was proposed here by Ray T. Miller, candidate for the Democratic nomination for governor.

Miller, in a statement issued from his office here before leaving for Steubenville, proposed:

Elimination—of the sales tax on all purchases below 30 cents.

Abolition—of the sales tax on medicines, preparations for personal hygiene and household cleaning necessities.

Return—to the formulas of 60 per cent to the schools and 40 per cent to local communities for distributing the millions of dollars raised by sales taxes.

Miller spoke at a dinner meeting in Steubenville arranged by former members of Machine Gun Company B, 134th Battalion, which he commanded as World War I captain.

Announcing his position, Miller asserted:

"Today we pay a penny tax on a dime purchase. That's far too much. We do not get into the established 3 per cent tax until we get into the 30-cent class of purchases."

Any sales tax on medicines works an added hardship on a majority of the citizens. It seems strange that Ohio should find it necessary to impose a tax on the ill.

"We must pay a tax on all medicines required for our children when they are born—and they must pay a sales tax on the things necessary to bury us."

Declaring the Democratic Party will fight to change the sales tax laws, Miller added:

"One man can't guarantee or promise these things. It will require unified action by a governor and a friendly legislature, but I believe public opinion should be strongly behind us in our efforts to make the sales tax equitable."

Finding out that a Democratic governor (George White) first set up the 60-40 formula for sales tax allocation, Miller declared:

"This money was never intended to be held in a state treasury to create big surpluses for various state administrations."

Miller's current tour took him thru south-eastern Ohio until tonight when he will return here for the formal opening of his campaign in this country that night at Hotel Hollenden.

"Nope," said the proprietor. "Eddie didn't leave no vacancy."

As the Banner added, "There's no place for the Eddies because the days of competition have returned and customers want to be waited upon . . . they want to see clerks take an interest in their requests, give them courteous, attentive service and try to make them feel at home. That's just human nature."

During the war, many a store, from the big chains down to little shops, had to employ poor and disinterested help, because nothing better could be had. But we're getting back to normal now, and we're seeing again that retailing is a career. that it calls for very special talents and mental attitudes and capabilities, and that it isn't a job that anyone can do. Many of the larger stores carry on highly developed training programs for their employees, and these are of service to small stores as well, by raising the standards of retail service in general.

The customer is entitled to interested and intelligent service, whether he's after a pound of hamburger or a complete spring outfit, and retailing is giving it to him. That small percentage of stores which takes no interest in this basic form of public relations won't be in business long. And, like Eddie, they'll leave no vacancy.


