V večini Indije je nastopila zadnje dni deževna monzumska doba in prinesla obilico dežja. Tako bo vsaj vode dovolj, če že manjka hrane.

NEW DELHI, Ind. — Monzumsko deževje je nastopilo letos ob času in v obilni meri. Prebivalstvo po suhih prizadetih predelih se je oddahnilo: ima vsaj vodo, če že mora trpeti posmanjkanje hrane. Tega še ne bo kmalu konec, do bistvene spremembe ne bo prišlo do decembra, ko bo mogoče pospraviti prvo žetev. Pomanjkanje hrane se bo vendar čutilo po sodbi vlaže vsaj še dve leti, kajti vse zaloge so izčrpane in Indija bo še vsaj pol leta morala uvažati velike količine hrane iz tujine, da bo mogla za silo preživeti svoje prebivalstvo. To je v nekaterih predelih države Bihar v zadnjih mesecih dejansko umiralo od lakote, četudi oblasti tega niso marale javno priznati.

Z nastopom monzumskega deževja so se pojavili na trgu orehi in jedilno olje, ki ju v zadnjih mesecih skoraj ni bilo mogoče dobiti. Riž in pšenica sta na nakazniku že leta in pol, belo moko je mogoče dobiti le na čremnem trgu. Pečenje slaščic z mlekom in sirom je prepovedano. Nastopilo je tudi občutno pomanjkanje sladkorja. Vlada je povisala trošarino na čaj in kavo.

Izrael je odločen te čolne spraviti v prekop in tega nadzriati. Če bo Egipt to skušal preprečiti s silo, bo Izrael preprečil po prekopu tudi plovbo vseh egiptovskih čolnov in ladij. Tako je izraelski obrambni minister Dajan povedal poveljniku ZN gen. Bullu, ki je odgovoren za nadziranje premirja ob Sueškem prekopu.

Ameriško orožje skoro zopet na Srednji vzhod?

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Na tiskovni konferenci v sredo je državni tajnik Dean Rusk napisal, da nemara ne bo dolgo, ko bodo Združene države zopet začele pošiljati orožje prijateljskim državam na Srednjem vzhodu, da obdrže ravnovesje sil, ki je v nevarnosti, odkar posilja Sovjetska zveza na debelo novo orožje v Egipt, Sirijo, Alžirijo in Irak.

Rusk je dejal, da se vlada Združenih držav posebno zanima za Jordanijo in da bo tej skoraj obnovila tako vojaško kot gospodarsko pomoč. To je dejansko že obnovila, saj je Jordaniji izplačala 2 milijona dolarjev, ki sta bila za njo določena še v lancem proračunu pomoci tujini.

Vojna pomoč pojde ne le v Jordanijo, ki je v preteklosti v glavnem do vivala orožje iz Združenih držav, ampak tudi v Savdsko Arabijo, s katero so Združene države vsa leta v dobroh odnosih, in verjetno tudi v Izrael, če bi nastopila nevarnost, da bi imelo razmerje sil obrniti v korist Naserja in njegovih zaveznikov.

Njegov prihod ni bil objavljen, zato je Dunaj zvedel zanj šele potem, ko se je Otto vrnil na Bavarsko.

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Se bo Biafra obdržala?

Zvezne čete Nigerije že tretji teden vneto pritiskajo od treh strani na Biafro, kot se imenuje nekdajna Vzhodna pokrajina od konca maja, ko se je proglašila za neodvisno državo. Glavne sile pritiskajo od severa proti glavnemu mestu Biafre Enugu. Pretekel soboto so v glavnem mestu Nigerije Lagos objavili, da so zvezne čete zasedle mesto Nsukka, ki leži kakih 47 milj severno od glavnega mesta Biafro ob lepih lakovanih cestih. Že naslednji dan je bilo objavljeno sporočilo iz Biafro, da so njene čete zopet gospodar Nsukke.

Dva tedna vojskovanja nista prinesla nobene odločitve in vojaški vodniki v Lagosu in v Enuguju so prepričani, da bo vojna dolga. V Lagosu upajo, da jo bodo do konca letosnjega leta morda le uspešno zaključili. Tam ne govore o vojni, ampak o "policjski akciji". V Biafri so med tem odločeni svojo neodvisnost braniti z vsemi razpoložljivimi sredstvi. Ali jim bo to uspelo ali ne, to je vprašanje, ki ne zanima le črno Afriko, ampak tudi svet preko nje.

Biafra obsega okoli 77,000 kvadratnih kilometrov površine in ima okoli 14 milijonov prebivalcev, skoraj izključno samo pripadnikov Bantu črncev plemena Ibo. Ti so po večini kristjani ter v kulturnem in gospodarskem pogledu daleč najnaprednejši v vsem tem delu Afrike in seveda še posebej Nigerije. Tudi njihova dežela predstavlja najrodotvornejši in najbogatejši del vse Nigerije. Razvito ni le poljedelstvo, ampak tudi obrt in delno že tudi industrija. Najvažnejša so velika ležišča petroleja, naravnega plina in premoga. Producija petroleja je že lani dosegla 20 milijonov ton, v prihodnjih 7 letih pa jo upajajo povzeti na 100 milijonov ton, kolikor petroleja na leto daje sedaj petrolejski vrelci v Libiji. Dohodki od petroleja znašajo že sedaj blizu 200 milijonov dolarjev letno.

Severni del Nigerije, kjer živi večinsko pleme Haussa, je delno preria delno pa na pol puščava. Ozemlje je primerno za živinorejo kot za poljedelstvo, ker manjka moči. Verjetno krije pod svojo pvršino tudi rudna bogastva, toda to še ni preiskano. Področje, kjer živi pleme Haussa, je gospodarsko najbolj zaostalo, v socialnem pogledu pa vlaž tam še vedno nekak fevdalni sistem. Predel Nigerije zahodno od Biafro in južno od področja plemena Haussa je gospodarsko bolj razvit in tudi prebivalstvo je na višji kulturni ravni, vendar zaostaja v vseh pogledih za Biafro.

Biafra sama po sebi bi lahko živel kot neodvisna država in bi gospodarsko brez dvoma naglo napredovala in se povzpela na celo vseh držav črne Afrike. Z ohranitvijo njene neodvisnosti bi Nigerija izgubila večji del gospodarskih sredstev in finančnih virov, ki naj bi pomagali pri gospodarskem razvoju zaostalega severa Nigerije. Zato je razumljivo, da je zvezna vlada pod vodstvom generala Gowona odločena z vsemi razpoložljivimi silami Biafro uničiti, predno se ji bo posrečilo utrditi in doseči priznanje drugih držav. Značilno je, da je dal general Gowon ukaz za napad takoj, ko je zvedel, da je mednarodna družba, ki črpa petrolej v Biafri, sklenila plačati tej delež na dobičku namesto vlad v Lagosu.

Petrolej v Biafri je važen posebno za Veliko Britanijo, ki trenutno ne more do petroleja v arabskih deželah Srednjega vzhoda, oziroma mora tega voziti daleč okoli Južne Afrike, dokler je Sueški prekop zaprt.

General Ojukwu, vojaški guverner v Enugu, ki je 30. maja letos oklical neodvisnost Biafre v prepričanju, da je to najboljše za blagostanje, napredek in varnost pripadnikov plemena Ibo, je študiral in uspešno zaključil svoje šolanje na univerzi v Oxfordu na Angleškem kot sin bogatega Ibo-trgovca. Zaveda se teže svoje odločitve, vendar je prepričan, da mu bo uspelo ohraniti neodvisnost Biafro. Pri tem mu utegne pomagati prav sedanja kriza na Srednjem vzhodu, ki je dvignila pomen petroleja iz Biafro. London je na ta petrolej trenutno zelo vezan in ne gleda rad motnje v njegovi dobavi, dokler ne bo dobil zagotovila za nemoteno dobavo od drugod.

Države črne Afrike so pozvale že prve dni po začetku sovražnosti obe bojujoči se strani k mirni rešitvi sporu. Posebno se je za to zavzel predsednik Kenije Kenyatta. Ti pozivi za sedaj še niso rodili uspeha. Dokler ne bosta nasprotnika preskusila svojih sil na bojišču, verjetno tudi ne bosta pokazala zanimanja za ta poziv.

Odlöčitev na bojišču je negotova. Zvezna vlada v Lagosu razpolaga z okoli 10,000 vojaki, Biafra pa le z okoli 5.000. Zvezna vlada ne more vseh svojih sil poslati proti Biafri, ker mora skrbeti za red in mir na obsežnem ozemlju Nigerije, kjer prebivalstvo tudi ni posebno zadovoljeno. Boj proti Biafri nemara podpira dejansko le pleme Haussa, pleme Yeruba, ki živi zahodno od Biafro in ni muslimanske vere, je bilo doslej vedno v dobrih odnosih s plemenom Ibo. General Gowon se zaveda nerodnega po-

ložaja in bi rad svojo "policjsko akcijo" čim prej končal, toda to ne bo lahko, posebno ne, če bo petrolejska družba res plačevala olje Biafri in bo ta imela na razpolago denar za nakup orožja in plačilo belih najemnikov, brez katerih ni nobenega vojskovana v črni Afriki. Za sedaj ima osrednja vlada v Lagosu prednost, ker razpolaga z nekaj stariimi, manjšimi vojnimi ladjami, in je razglasila blokado obale Biafre. Če jo bo mogla res uspešno izvajati, je seveda druga stvar.

BESEDA IZ NARODA

Klic po svobodi

CLEVELAND, O. — Leto 1945 je bilo leto največjega razočaranja narodov Srednje in Vzhodne Evrope, ko so Zapadni zaveznički po končani drugi svetovni vojni prepustili komunizmu kar celo vrste držav v podnjemiljenje. Tem državam se je pridružila še vrsta kakih šest milijonov beguncev iz vseh teh držav. Iz vseh držav in od beguncev pa so se čuli klaci po svobodi.

Ta klic je bil tako močan, da ga Zapadni moči so presili, da bo v skoraj dvestoletni zgodovini najvišje dvigale baklo svobode, so prisluhnile temu klicu in tedanji predsednik Harry Truman je sam čakal, kdaj se mu ponudi prilika, da se upre komunizmu. Ta prilika se mu je nudila spomladi leta 1947, ko so komunistični gverilci skoraj premagali protikomunistično vojsko v Grčiji.

In takrat je predsednik Truman izjavil: "Kjerkoli se bo pokazalo, da hoče komunizem s podtalnimi akcijami ali z orojjem širiti svojo oblast, se mu bo Amerika postavila po robu!" Ta izjava predsednika Trumana je znana kot Trumanova doktrina.

Od takrat je preteklo dvajset let. In Amerika je ostala zvesta Trumanovi doktrini: pomagala je Grčiji, ob berlinski blokadi je pokazala vsemu svetu, da hoče vsako ceno pomagati svobodnemu svetu v boju proti komunizmu in ni enostavno prepustila Sovjetski zvezzi Zapadnega Berlinja, ampak je po zraku več kot leta dni prevzela hrano, vse potrebe in celo pitno vodo v Zahodni Berlin — tako, da je Sovjetska zvezda moralna uvideti, da Amerika misli resno. Sledila je Koreja. Nad 35,000 ameriških vojakov je tam zgubilo svoje življenje. — Dobro nam je še v spominu, kako je predsednik Kennedy resno posegel, ko je hotel Sovjetska zvezda zgraditi svoja oporišča tik pred vrati Amerike — na Kubi.

Nove borbe proti komunizmu pa niso olajšale trpljenje ljudi rod Zelezno zaveso v Vzhodni Srednji Evropi. Amerika je čutila, da mora nekaj storiti.

Tako je leta 1959 tedanji predsednik Združenih držav razglasil "Teden zasluženih narodov", da bi trpečim narodom vsaj pokazal, da svobodni svet še misli nanje in da niso pozabljeni.

Zelo pomemben govor je imel tudi Ralph J. Perk.

Mislim pa, da je bila najvažnejša točka vsega programa rezolucija odbora "Tedna zasluženih narodov", ki jo je sestavil profesor dr. Mihail S. Pap, ravnatelj Instituta za študij Sovjetje in vzhodnoevropskih narodov na John Carroll Univerzi v Clevelandu.

Resolucija je precej obširna, žal, da je ne moremo objaviti, ker je trenutno ni pri roki. Zdi se mi pa, da sta v njej dve poglaviti mesti: in sicer tisto, ki opozarja Ameriko na nepravilno prikazovanje komunizma na ameriških nekatoliških collegih, in pa tista, da bi moral v Washingtonu sprejeti odbor "Tedna zasluženih narodov" kot stalni posvetovalni organ, ki naj bi Ameriko stalno in sproti obvezal o položaju vseh narodov, ki so za želesno ali bambusovo zaveso, in jim nasvetoval ukrepe, ki so potrebni, da se ti naredi osvobojeni.

Med tem so pa novi milijoni ljudi postali ogroženi po komunistih v Vietnamu in novi milijoni begunciv so zopet v ospredje potisnili vprašanje svobode, ko se prejšnji narodi niso bili osvobojeni.

Amerika pa je ostala zvesta

Česnjev cvet iz Hirošime

V frankfurtskem palmovem gaju sta se letos spet razcveteli česnji, zrasli iz semen drevesa, ki je ob atomski eksploziji pred 22 leti ostalo živo, čeprav je bilo razmeroma zelo blizu srednja množična smrtni. Tista česnja je bila izpostavljena tako močni radioaktivnosti, da je minilo 13 let, preden so se iz njenih cvetov razvila semena.

Leta 1958, 13 let po eksploziji atomske bombe, je prinesel japonski študent vrečko s 150 česnjevimi semeni, darilo hirošimskoga župana Tadae Vatanabu mestu Frankfurt na Nemškem.





The New Etiquette Of Silver Service

Once upon a time, it was the custom for brides to tuck away their wedding silver soon after the thank-you notes had been written and bring it out only on formal or very festive occasions. This custom has happily disappeared; today's etiquette (another name for common sense) permits, and even insists, that anything as lovely and as durable as silver be used often and in as many ways as the owner's talents and imagination can suggest.

The one unbreakable rule for using silver, either flatware or the hollow ware serving dishes, is that silver must shine. This is best and most easily accomplished by frequent to daily use which prevents the accumulation of tarnish that is silver's worst enemy (and no friend to the homemaker, either, as it indicates careless housekeeping). Silver in day-to-day use needs touching up with polish not more than two or three times a year. It also develops the patina that is so treasured in heirloom pieces.

Silver is "correct" the clock around. Flatware, of course, is to be used only when and where food is served. Silver serving dishes, on the other hand, have no limit as to the occasions and places they might properly appear. They lend dignity and graciousness not only to the table but to home decor as well. The bowls, trays and vegetable dishes can be used as containers to enhance and mirror the beauty of flowers, foliage or fruit arranged in or on them.

And, since the current trend in home decoration is to "mix or match" style periods, pieces such as Presentation Silver (a collection of serving pieces de-

Clothing Children For The Future

Cuyahoga County Welfare Director Eugene F. Burrs called for the establishment of a new private charity to provide school clothing for needy children in the wake of a protest march by welfare clients June 30.

Burns pointed out that thousands of dollars are being spent this summer to control or even riot. Private money would be better invested in a new charity that would let the poor know by concrete action that we want their children as well as our own to succeed.

"We who serve that segment of society where poverty has become a permanent condition know that clothing is the greatest need," the welfare director said. Welfare grants which will be increased in Ohio to 83% of the minimum standard cover rent, food and utility bills.

Clothing requests were in the majority in the petitions presented by the marchers June 30. Inner city schools have long reported clothing shortages among poor children. Efforts made in the past to hold used clothing drives have always been "unsatisfactory" Burns reported.

"Second hand clothing merely intensifies the frustrations of the poor" he commented.

"This continuing problem should be met on a businesslike basis," the welfare director said. "I am suggesting that this community with over 46,000 children on welfare aid almost as many living on low incomes needs a new private charity with sufficient endowment to supply school clothing needs out of interest on capital."

"Since this proposal — to equip

every school child in a needy family with a basic wardrobe once a year — aims at a change in class differential, I feel it is properly the function of a private charity," he said.

Burns said that "in order to reverse the spiral to futility that breeds the man and woman with nothing to lose by violence" a school clothing foundation would "give the

CONGRESS RETURNS. After a Canal and that the Administration brief respite for the Independence in no way forfeit, cede, negotiate, Day observance Congress returned or transfer any of these sovereign this week to face a massive backlog rights or jurisdiction to any other of legislation. This is a good time to take a look at the legislative picture, and report on the work of the Congress up to this point. By this time, we should have passed most of the annual appropriation bills so that the federal agencies may have the finances with which to conduct their business. Yet five remain to be passed by the House (Foreign Aid, Public Works, Military Construction, Transportation, and a closing supplemental providing funds for the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, Office of Economic Opportunity, and Higher Education). The Senate is far behind the House, having completed action on only one appropriation bill, for the Department of Interior. Again, this year the Majority had to resort to the policy of passing a "continuing resolution" to permit the federal government to go on spending at the rate of last year's funding until the regular bills are approved.

Among the major new legislation enacted by the 90th Congress are these: \$12.1 billion supplemental funds for Vietnam; revision and 4-year extension of the Selective Service Act; restoration of the 7% investment tax credit and certain accelerated depreciations; \$21.1 billion for defense procurement; establishment of a House Committee on Standards and Ethics; extension of National Teacher Corps; as well as an increase of \$28 billion in the national debt limit. Bills remaining to be acted on besides the appropriations items include: Foreign Aid authorization; anti-crime legislation; extension of the Economy Opportunity Act; Social Security increase; postal and classified salary adjustments; and there is a good possibility the Administration will push for a tax increase to make up some of its deficit. All of this adds up to very busy days ahead!



HOW THOUSANDS WATCH MILLIONS MADE



CLEAR-AS-A-BELL EXPLANATIONS are given by specially trained tour leaders who take visitors around the New York Stock Exchange every 15 minutes from 10 a.m. to 3:15 p.m., Monday through Friday. The tour takes about an hour during which participants learn simply and entertainingly how the market operates and how they can own a share in America.

New York, N.Y. (ED) — Every year over 60,000 enthralled visitors stand in wonder and observe the hectic and exhilarating view of the trading floor of the New York Stock Exchange — the high point of the free tour of the nation's marketplace.

The Exchange attracts sightseers from all over the country, not to mention the world. On a recent day, for example, visitors represented some 43 different states and 32 foreign countries, which is one reason the smartly uniformed, specially trained guides have to be able to speak a variety of languages.

Visitors' traffic at the Exchange at 20 Broad Street during the 10 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. market hours is sufficiently heavy to make it New York City's third most popular ported in their evening papers.



HIGH POINT OF A VISIT to the New York Stock Exchange is the view from the visitors' gallery. Here over 600,000 sightseers are annually fascinated by the hectic activity of the trading floor below. Little wonder that the Stock Exchange is — along with the Statue of Liberty and the United Nations — one of New York's three most popular tourist attractions.

On the Gallery overlooking the any one of three lively and entertaining films on investing shown in the Exhibit Hall's fully equipped theatre. The films are "What Makes Us Tick," a 13-minute animated cartoon, "Your Share in Tomorrow," a 27-minute all-color documentary, and "The Lady and the Stock Exchange," a 27-minute feature starring Eddie Bracken and Janet Blair. The whole tour — which starts every 15 minutes and generally lasts about an hour — elicits very different responses. One elderly lady, for example, who'd been watching the floor activity plucked at the sleeve of a gallery guide and asked, "Quick, what's the name of that stock? It's gone up three points while I've been watching." What the lady pointed at was the large electric sign on the opposite end of the Stock Exchange that ticks off the time of day in numbers: 1:30, 1:31, 1:32...

If you're planning a visit to New York soon, the New York Stock Exchange is a "must see" item for your sightseeing itinerary. The hour or so you'll spend at 20 Broad St — minutes away from Times Square — will bring dividends of both moments.

In an adjoining Exhibit Hall a number of corporate and Stock Exchange displays help illustrate the investment process. One animated exhibit mounted on a twelve-by-five foot view of the trading floor features color-coded lights and a step-by-step demonstration of the Market Data System.

If a visitor touring the Stock Exchange doesn't happen to be a shareholder when he begins the visit, looks down onto the trading floor and hears the commentary of what evolves on the floor, he is apt to become more interested in investing after the tour. The last part of the visit is generally devoted to

A visit to the Exchange rates high, its interest never fluctuates and everybody comes out the richer. So say the thousands who have watched — with fascination — how millions are made.

United Appeal Campaign

Trustees of the United Appeal of Greater Cleveland approved a record goal of \$16,729,044. for the October 16-26 fund-raising campaign.

This is \$1,006,860, or 6.4 per cent more than was raised in last year's United Appeal and represents the highest dollar increase goal in the nearly fifty-year history of federated fund-raising in Greater Cleveland.

In spite of the sharp increase, the goal will still fall \$2,334,694 below the certified 1966 needs of 152 Red Feather agencies and the Red Cross, which receive UA support. Agency requests totaled \$19,073,737.

A Goal-Setting Committee of 29 business, industry and civic leaders recommended the goal to United Appeal trustees. The committee, in making its recommendation, noted that the higher goal reflects an increasing concern on the part of this community's health and welfare agencies toward meeting pressing social, health and civic problems. The report also noted significant new sources of requests for agency help.

Part of the increase in goal stems from the addition of five new agencies to the United Appeal family. These are The Society for Crippled Children, The Cuyahoga County Association for Retarded Children and Adults, the Cleveland Homemaker Service Association, and two suburban agencies — the Geauga County Mental Health Clinic and the Society for Handicapped Children of Medina County.

Increased costs of maintaining current services, the continuing of services started with Foundation or special financing, and a forward movement to meet deficiencies in service, account for other increases.

Additional step-up of Red Cross and USO services to servicemen and women in Vietnam and additional funds for Red Cross disaster services will require added support dollars.

William C. Treuhaft, president of United Appeal, said, "Our community faces a genuine challenge to meet this goal — to keep its privately-supported agencies alive, effective and flexible."



Ice Cream Takes To Cake

The Borden Kitchen did give a hint of the surprise to come, though, by cloaking the cake in a pink frosting of heavy cream and sugar, then cresting it with plump fresh strawberries.


Heavenly Ice-Cream-Filled Cake

(Makes one 9-inch tube cake)

1 (1-lb. 2-1/2-oz.) package	2 cups (1 pint) heavy cream
devil's-food cake mix	3 tablespoons sugar
1 quart Lady Borden	3 tablespoons kirsch, optional
strawberry ice cream	1-2 drops red food coloring

Prepare cake mix in a 9 x 3-1/2 inch square or round tube cake pan according to package directions. Bake in a moderate (350°F.) oven 40-45 minutes. Cool. Remove from pan; cool thoroughly. Let ice cream soften about 15 minutes at room temperature. With a sharp knife, slice a 1-inch horizontal layer from top of cake. Carefully lift off and set aside. To make a tunnel for filling: cut around cake 1/2-inch in from center and 1/2-inch in from outer edge; leave a 1/2-inch base. With a fork, gently scoop cake out of tunnel. Carefully spoon softened ice cream evenly into cake shell. Replace layer cut from top; cover ice cream and press on gently. Place in freezer about 3 hours, or until ice cream is very firm. Remove from freezer 15 minutes before serving time. In a small-size mixing bowl, combine heavy cream, sugar, food coloring and kirsch. Beat just until stiff peaks form. Frost sides and top of cake. If desired, garnish with fresh strawberries. Serve immediately.

A SPEEDY STORY



A REAL "SWINGER" — Everything about this SST (Supersonic Transport) plane swings—from the nose, which can hinge down to give the pilot unobstructed vision, to the wings which can swing from a 20-degree sweep on landing to 72 degrees for cruising at 1850 miles per hour. With TWA first in line when the planes roll off the assembly line in the 1970's, the Boeing-designed SST will be the first plane capable of going coast to coast in about two hours, around the world in a day. It's enough to give today's "jet set" an inferiority complex.

New York, N.Y. (ED) — Think the jet set travels fast? There's a time coming when they'll be considered slow pokes. Imagine 300 air "commuters" leaving New York at 7:00 a.m., arriving in Honolulu in time for a second breakfast and a refreshing swim in the blue Pacific, pushing on to Tokyo for lunch and a shopping spree, and then pressing on around the world to New York for breakfast. All this in about 24 hours and in broad daylight all the way.

Impossible? Today, yes. But in the 1970's (just around the corner) this kind of "commuting" will be done without any effort worth mentioning. For the miracle of supersonic air travel is speeding within reach faster than it takes to tell about it.

When the Federal Aviation Agency early this year gave the go-ahead to build an 1850-miles per hour Supersonic Transport (SST), it opened the curtain to an era that had existed only in science fiction. And when Trans World Airlines became first in line for delivery of the first U.S. made SST by depositing down payments with the FAA back in 1963, it set the stage for a revolution in commercial air travel that has no parallel.

Even in today's sophisticated era, with astronauts whizzing around the world in minutes, the mind still boggles at the thought of traveling faster than sound. Just what does 1850 miles an hour mean in terms we can comprehend? It means going one mile every two seconds. It means traveling from New York City to Albany in less time than it takes to read this article. It means traveling faster than the earth rotates — racing the sun and winning, departing New York and arriving in Los Angeles an hour earlier than you've left. It means that distances no longer will be considered in terms of miles, but rather, in minutes, and that we'll be next door neighbors to the whole world, because TWA's SST will be able to circle the globe in the span of a day, including ground stops.

The SST will be a four-engine plane. Designed by GE, the engines are awesome packages of power. Twenty-five feet long and six in diameter, they each will deliver more than 60,000 pounds of thrust. And controlling the flights will be a team of TWA experts who already have "logged" hundreds of thousands of miles of supersonic "flight" — in rigorously controlled practice sessions. TWA flight planners, for instance, have been mapping SST routes and alternate routes meeting every type of flying

condition around the world with these days... thanks to an evergreen tree!

Golden-skinned grapefruit are the product of an evergreen, though not the cone-bearing needle-leaved kind we of more northern climates are used to. It's a broad-leaf tree that provides this tart-tasting citrus. (In fact, all citrus fruit trees are such evergreens.)

The fruit of the tree, however, is no stranger to us. And Midwest consumers will be happy to learn that grapefruit promises to be one of our most plentiful foods this winter.

Pink, red or white-meat... with seeds or without... all types of the golden-skinned grapefruit are headed for market in great numbers.

Both Florida — which supplies over 70 percent of the world's grapefruit — and Texas have larger than usual crops. The "bonus" in these states will help boost the harvest about a third above average, according to the U.S. Department of Agriculture.

Numerically, the grapefruit harvest will total some 50 million boxes — boxes which contain 32 to 35 pounds each.

Homemakers will find this means grapefruit will be readily available — and likely wearing attractive price tags -- for some weeks.

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Soup As Cool As A Cucumber

Yogurt-Cucumber Soup
(Makes 2 1/2 cups or 2 servings)
2 large cucumbers
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 1/2 teaspoons sugar
1 tablespoon olive oil

Peel cucumbers; slice thinly. In medium-size mixing bowl mix cucumbers with salt, sugar, and olive oil; fold in yogurt. Refrigerate about 2 hours. Spoon about half of the mixture into blender; blend 15 to 20 seconds. Pour into individual soup dish. Blend remaining mixture, if desired, garnish with sliced cucumber and fresh dill.
