WHO IS NOT QUALIFIED TO RUN FOR DELEGATE TO CONVENTION?

In response to many queries as to who can and who cannot run for delegate to the coming convention I offer the following information:

A member cannot run for delegate:

1. If he is under 21 years of age;
2. If he is not a citizen of the United States of America;
3. If he cannot read and write;
4. If he is a member of the Union less than 1 year;
5. If he is a member of his lodge less than 6 months;
6. If he did not attend six regular meetings of his lodge immediately preceding the election of delegate;
7. If he is not insured for all benefits the Union offers; (a member not insured for sick and indemnity benefits, or disability benefits, is, therefore, not qualified to run for delegate);
8. If within the last five years he has been convicted of a felony;
9. If at the time of the election he is not a member in good standing.
