### Češki zunanji minister trn v moskovski peti

Zunanji minister Cernikove vlade ČSR Jiri Hajek je bil v času vdora sovjetskih čet v Jugoslaviji in tako ostal na svobodi.

CLEVELAND, O. — Vse so v Moskvi dobro preračunali in predvideli, le pri češkem zunanjem ministru Hajeku so se uračunali. Mož je bil namreč v sodni noči, ko so ruske čete vdrle na Češkoslovaško, v Jugoslaviji na počitnicah. Mislijo, da je še zmeraj tam. Tito ga ne bo preganjal, šel mu bo na roko, kjer bo le mogel. To pa za Hajeka pomeni veliko, saj ima preko Titove diplomacije lahko in hitro zvezo z vsemi češkimi poslaništvami po vsem svetu in je obenem še njihov šef. Lahko jim torej naroča stvari, ki niso volji ruski diplomaciji. To se je deloma že godilo na seji Varnostnega sveta preteklo sredo.

Rusi bodo naravno močno prislikali na predsednika republike L. Svobodo, da naj Hajeka odpokliče. Svoboda se ne bo mogel dolgo časa upirati ruskemu pritisku, še posebno sedaj, ko je gotovo nekje na Češkem v hišnem zaporu. Pa tudi, če ga odpokliče, kako naj to Hajeku sporoči?

V zadregi bodo tudi vsi češki diplomat, kar jih je na tujem. Koga naj poslušajo: ali Hajeka ali novega zunanjega ministra v Pragi, ki bo le trobilo moskovske politike? Tako se bo lahko zgodilo marsikateremu češkemu dogodom, kar se še ni nobenemu drugemu. Kot je moral pred okroglo 30 leti iti v begunstvo pred Hitlerjem, tako mu je usoda znova odprla pot v begunstvo pred — tovarijem Brežnjevom. Imel bo pa tolažbo: v podobnem položaju se bo znašel marsikateri češki tovariš, ki je vnet za Dubčeka, ne pa za njegove naslednike. Bo to nova vrsta političnega begunstva, ki ga svet danes še ni poznal. Kako se bodo pa Beneševi in Dubčekovi begunci gledali med seboj, to je pa drugo vprašanje.

**Zopet rakete na Saigon**

SAIGON, J. Viet. — Včeraj zgodaj zjutraj so rdeči pognali okoli 15 raket proti sredini glavnega mesta, ki je imelo dodelj 2 meseca miru. Kakih 20 minut kasneje je prvemu napadu sledil drugi. Ena od raket je zadela strešni stolpič poslopja narodne skupščine. To je bilo ob času napada z izjemo varuhov in oskrbnika prazno. Tako ni bil nihče ranjen.

Drugod je bi uspeh napada rdečih hujši. Skupno naj bi bilo 14 oseb pri teh napadih mrtvih, 45 pa ranjenih, med njimi večina otroci. V kitajskem predmetju Cholon so rakete povzročile večji požar.

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Češka kriza je zmeda tudi predsedniškega kandidata McCarthyja. Je dal posebno izjavo, ki v njej kritizira stališče naše federacije. Po njegovem se naša dežela ne sme zgrajati nad dogodki v Pragi, saj ima sama na vesti kar preko Osrednjega višanja pa vse v Mekongovo delto.

Pretekli teden je v bojih padlo skupno 159 ameriških vojakov, 1814 pa je bilo ranjenih. Južnovietnamske čete so imele v istem času 258 mrtvih in 738 ranjenih. rdečih pa je padlo v bojih 1393.

### Humphrey je ostal brez pomoči Bele hiše?

WASHINGTON, D.C. — Vesti iz okolice podpredsednika H. H. Humphreya trdijo, da ta ne sme pričakovati veliko pomoči iz Bele hiše ne v naporu za doseg predsedniškega imenovanja in ne v njem slediči volivni borbi. Bele hiša je postala v zadnjem času do Humphreya baje "nekam hladna".

Med tem so Humphreyjevi glavni pomočniki zelo hladni do vseh demokraskih vodnikov, ki bi radi pomagali Humphreju. To naj bi bil zaključen krog, ki ne mara, da bi vanj prihajala "nova kri" in s tem zmanjšala njegov vpliv in moč. Nemara se ne zavedajo, da je to pitje na medvedovo kožo. Humphrey bo skoraj gotovo res imenovan za demokratskega predsedniškega kandidata prihodnji teden v Chicago, toda ali bo v novembri izvoljen ali ne, je pa druga stvar.

### Dvoboj med Ameriko in Rusijo v Varnostnem svetu ZN

CLEVELAND, O. — Kdor je imel srečo in "ujel" v sredo zvečer na televiziji del razprave v Varnostnem svetu o čehoslovaški tragediji, mu je in bo prihranljeno mnogo vrtanja v dnevnih novicah, z kaj sploh gre. Na televiziji sta govorila najprvo ruski diplomat Jakob Malik, potem pa njegov ameriški nasprotnik in naš delegat George W. Ball. Prvi vtis, ki ga je človek dobil, je bila razlika med komunističnim in s v o b odnim svetom. Malik ni ravno diplomat tretje vrste v ruskem zunanjem ministrstvu, pa je vendarle skrbno pazil, da ni rekel ne besede preveč, ne besede premalo o tega, kar je imel napisano pred seboj. Bral je nameč "pismo iz Moskve". Za ta posel bi bil tovariš Gromiko lahko odredil tudi navadnega tajnika. Čisto drugače se je obnašal ameriški delegat Ball. Tudi on je imel pred seboj tipkan gradio, toda ga ni bral. Je rabil

mo ponavlja, kar je reklo ob času madžarske krize.

Če je tovariš Malik v tehničnem pogledu dobro odigral svojo vlogo, akoravno njegovo stališče ni zmagalo na seji Varnostnega sveta, je slabše odrezal a m e r i š k i zastopnik Ball. Res ni mogel groziti z rabi sile, ker na kaj takega svobodni svet z Ameriko načelni niti ne misli. Lahko bi bil pa vsaj zagrozil z bojkotom moskovskega režima. Edino tega se v Kremlju bojijo, povsod drugod so neranljivi, vsaj mislijo tako.

Sicer pa še ni vse izgubljeno. Varnostni svet odnosno generalna skupščina ZN bo sta imela še dosti časa, da lahko zobjeta Moskvo tam, kjer je res zabol. S praznimi protesti tega ne bosta dosegla. Seveda pa grozi svobodnemu svetu znova stara nevarnost: pomanjkanje sloge v taktiki napram rdečemu imperializmu. To se je že velikokrat zgodilo, žal se lahko tudi sedi I. A. daj ponovi.

### Sovjetija vetirala resolucijo, ki zahteva umik zasedbenih čet iz ČSR

Varnostni svet je po dolgi razpravi in po vsakravnem sovjetskom zavlačevanju le prisel do glasovanja o resoluciji zahodnih sil, ki zahteva umik sovjetskih in satelitskih čet iz Češkoslovaške republike. Za resolucijo je glasovalo 10 članov Varnostnega sveta, 3 so se glasovanja vzdržali, 2, Sovjetija in Madžarska sta glasovali proti. Sovjetiški glas je bil 105. veto, odkar Združeni narodi obstojajo. — V Pragi je prevezla vodstvo KP kvislinska "trojka", ko je predsednik republike L. Svoboda v Moskvi na razgovorih z vodniki ZSSR o usodi ČSR.

mesto Dubčeka trojko: Vasil Bičak, Dražomir Kolder in Alois Indra. Prvi je Slovák, drugi Ceh, oba sta bila člana prezidija Centralnega komiteta KP, v katerem sta zastopala trdo stalinistično linijo. Indra je bil eden od tajnikov Centralnega komiteta pod Dubčekom. Imenovani se niso mogli baje zediniti niti za to, kakšno in kolikšno odgovornost naj vsak izmed njih ima.

Dejansko oblast v ČSR imata poveljnik zasedbenih čet ruski gen. Ivan G. Pavlovsky, poveljnik ruskih kopnih sil in namestnik obrambnega ministra ZSSR, ter sovjetski poslanik v Pragi Stefan V. Cervonenko.

#### Predsednik ČSR

Ludvik Svoboda v Moskvi Predsednik Češkoslovaške republike gen. Ludvik Svoboda je ponovno govoril preko radijskih postaj pod nadzorom zasedbenih sil iz Moskve. Dejal je, da je prisel tja, da se dogovori z vodniki Sovjetske zveze o bodočnosti Češkoslovaške republike. Z njim ni nobenih predstavnikov vlad.

Po vsej verjetnosti so v Moskvi tudi vsi prijeti vodniki ČSR z Dubčekom na čelu, če so seveda sploh še živi. Neka poročila, ki so jih prestregli na zahodu s privatnih oddajnikov v ČSR, namreč trdijo, da so Rusi Dubčeka umorili takoj, ko so ga dobili v roke.

Moskva je trenutno gospodar položaja v ČSR in brez dvoma bo prej ali slej postavila tam vladu, ki bo v njenem imenu vzdrževala "red" in skušala uveljaviti moskovske linije na poti v socializem. Na dolgo roko je Moskva vendar izgubila, obrnila je proti sebi Čehe in Slovake, pa tudi vse naprednejše in liberalnejše ljudi med komunisti v svobodnem svetu. Francoska, italijanska, angleška in avstralska partija so javno obsoidle zasedbo ČSR, isto sta storili Romunija in Jugoslavija, kjer so komunisti na vladu in je zadnja celo članica Varšavske zveze.

Sovjetiški vojaški nastop proti zastopnikom svobodnejše smeri v ČSR so obsoidle tudi vse socialdemokratske stranke in vladu, obsoidle ga je veliko držav neutralnega bloka, med njimi Indija.

Združene države so sovjetski vojaški nastop spravile pred ZN, dosegle tam obsodbo Moskve, to je pa tudi vse, kar naj bi bilo. Trdijo, da je predsednik L. B. Johnson hotel v sredo zjutraj objaviti sestanek s predsednikom vlade ZSSR Kosyginom in bližnjim prihodnosti, pa je moral to opustiti zaradi sovjetskega nastopa proti ČSR. Načrt o tem sestanku klub sovjetski zasedbeni ČSR baje še ni pade in vodo.

ČSR je drobiž, za katerega se v Washingtonu po vsem sodeč ne menijo dosti, sicer pa je ČSR v sovjetski interesni sferi, kot je bila ta razmejena še v času predsednika Eisenhowerja, kamor Washington ne sme vtičati svojega nosu, če noče, da mu ga ne bodo odrezali, kot je včeraj v Varnostnem svetu zagrozil sovjetski zastopnik Jakob Malik.

Ignacij je buljil predse. Izne-naden se je zaledal v Melito, ki je nemirna sedela ob mizici pri čajniku.







Roll dough out on lightly floured board or canvas to form a 16x12-inch rectangle. Cut into 4x1-inch strips. Wrap strips around wiener pieces; press end of strip to seal. Place, seam side down, on ungreased cookie sheets. Bake in preheated oven (425°F.) 10 to 12 minutes.

## Observing Bishop Baraga Centennial

The Baraga Centennial Year is being observed throughout the Midwest in honor of the missionary bishop, Frederic Baraga, Apostle of the Chippewas. His work in the Upper Peninsula of Michigan from 1831 until his death in 1868 is recorded in the annals of American and Indian history. He is remembered not only as a religious leader, but for his contributions as one of the first to bring civilization to the American Indians of Lake Superior region. Baraga is the author of the first grammar and dictionary in the native Chippewa and Ottawa languages, which are still being used today and are considered excellent aids for missionaries throughout the world.

Because of Baraga's last ecumenical work that is meaningful still today, a local Chicago committee under the auspices of the American Slovenian Civic Alliance, Frank Schonta President, and Ludwig A. Leskovar, Executive Secretary, has undertaken an action to rename West 22nd Place as Baraga Place. This street was selected because at 1852 W. 22nd Place is located St. Stephen Slovenian Catholic Church and many of the residents of the largest Slovenian community in Chicago live there. Baraga was born in Slovenia in 1797.

Chicago as a city also bears influence on Baraga's life for it was the Chicago Bishop, Van de Veldt, who in 1852, speaking before a concilium of bishops, cited Baraga's qualifications as the best and most outstanding candidate as the first bishop of the newly formed diocese of upper Michigan with the words: *Optissimum omnium*.

The Chicago Baraga committee of the ASCA is hoping to present a list of signatures of residents in the area to Alderman Vito Mazzullo and Alderman Fred Roti of the 25th and 1st Wards respectively, wherein 22nd Place lies, to be attached to their proposal for a city council act allowing the name change.

National Aviation Day was observed August 19. It is a day when most attention was directed toward the unbelievable advances that have taken place in the art of flying in the short space of time since the Wright Brothers lifted their frail craft off the ground at Kitty Hawk. Aircraft exhibits dramatized the marvelous performance, comfort, and speed of today's planes — planes of every kind and size. If you are in the right vicinity, you will see the small pleasure craft, as well as the planes that have become the tools of the businessman, and the jets that carry air travelers throughout the globe.

There are other aspects of the aviation age that cannot be paraded across an airport but are equally impressive. For one thing, the cost of living has increased by 50 per cent since 1947, yet the cost of air travel is lower than it was then and has decreased by 13 per cent during the last 5 years. The decline is more spectacular — and realistic — when put another way. Expressed in constant dollars of 1967 purchasing power, the average cost incurred by air passengers per mile of travel in 1967 was more than one-third less than in 1947. Another aspect of air travel that cannot be put on exhibit is the impact of the great jets flying internationally carrying millions of people each year to every nation on earth.

What this must inevitably mean in terms of greater understanding among all peoples will never be measured on a graph. Yet, it may well turn out to be the most decisive factor in reaching the ultimate goal of peace and a higher civilization.





## NUCLEAR MEDICINE

St. Vincent Charity Hospital has a machine that can picture a human organ and picture it more clearly than an x-ray. It can find a tumor and find it earlier than an x-ray.

Moreover, it can perform these feats in half the time it takes similar machines in other hospitals in the city. The machine, a radiosensitive duo-probe scanner, is the basic instrument of the exciting and rapidly growing radiologic subspecialty of nuclear medicine.

Charity Hospital's \$28,000 scanner, unlike the commonly used single-probe scanner, takes two views at once, thereby cutting the relatively long procedure time in half. It is the only duo-probe scanner in the Cleveland area.

Nuclear medicine is the use of radioactive drugs in the diagnosis and treatment of disease. While it plays a part at St. Vincent Charity Hospital in the treatment of thyroid disease and various blood irregularities, it is most valuable department head Dr. Mary Mohr said, because it has added important new procedures to the repertoire of the diagnostician.

The basic elements of a nuclear diagnostic procedure are the isotopes — the drugs — and the radiosensitive scanner.

An isotope is a special form of any element, such as gold, lead or mercury, which is made radioactive in an atomic reactor. The isotope will try to return to a non-radioactive state, and, in doing so, it gives off rays. These rays are radiation.

The nuclear medicine technician is a kind of prospector with a geiger counter. He administers the radioactive drug either orally or intravenously under the supervision of a physician, then picks up the rays with the sensitive probes of the scanner.

The scan works on the principle that different kinds of isotopes will go to different organs. For a thyroid scan, for example, the technician injects radioactive iodine, waits a set period of time for the drug to go to the thyroid gland, then puts the patient on a table under the scanner.

The probes move slowly over the area being tested, pick up the radiation from the drug, and a corresponding picture appears on paper and on film. The greater the concentration of rays in one area, the greater the intensity in the picture. In this way, the machine outlines the organ and notes any irregularities within it. Some masses, called hot areas, take up radiation, and they appear as dark spots on the scan. Others, known as cold areas, take up no radiation, and they appear as white areas.

A scan takes longer than a standard x-ray, but it provides more detailed information. It can indicate the exact size of an organ and pinpoint tumors and other causes of illness. In the case of the thyroid gland, it is the only method of visualization.

The scan also can indicate problems earlier than an x-ray and in some instances may make more complex x-ray procedures unnecessary.

A scan is painless and harmless. The patient receives no more radiation than he might from wearing a luminous dial watch. He feels no more than the prick of a needle. And, though still time-consuming, the once tedious four-hour procedure now takes about 30 to 45 minutes, thanks to the duo-probe scanner, larger probes and better isotopes.

Because isotopes have limited life spans, the hospital must order them regularly. Technetium, which lasts only a few hours, comes every morning at eight, while longer-lived isotopes, such as gold, iodine and strontium, arrive once a week.

Isotopes average about \$25 per dose, but the cost actually is greater because of waste. Technetium, which runs \$35 a dose, must be on hand at all times for brain scans. But if it isn't used the day it is delivered, it becomes useless.

A solution to this problem appears imminent, for the department hopes to obtain a license from the U.S. Atomic Energy Commission to operate a generator which produces technetium as it is needed.

The field of nuclear medicine is growing so rapidly that the supply of specially trained personnel cannot keep up with the demand. The one-year course of study for technicians is difficult, Miss Gibbons said, and as yet the Institute has the only formal training program in the country. Current trainees won't even come close to meeting the need for qualified technicians that will exist by 1970, she said.

Growth in Charity Hospital's department is expected to parallel growing national awareness of the value of nuclear medicine, Miss Gibbons said. "We're just now beginning to move up," she said.

She predicted the department will move into blood flow studies for locating blood clots and tumors. They also will begin studies of the

composition of patients' bodies, she said, to better understand changes in composition during various illnesses.

"Since nuclear medicine is such a new field," she explained, "views of its effectiveness always are changing. Methods used are changing, and this change represents a challenge. People must be educated to use this field to its full potential. Its possibilities for diagnostic use in the field of medicine are unlimited."
